


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National Merit Finalists: Liying Wu & Elizabeth Wolcott

The Sunshine State Scholar program recognizes top juniors around the state for their academic excellence in the area of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM).



Counselors Corner

Seniors:

Finish your last semester of high school on a positive note. Push towards that goal of walking across the stage in May and receiving your FPC diploma! Also begin to finalize your plans for life beyond FPC. Please turn in your college acceptance letters and military enlistments to your counselor.

Juniors:

Prepare for the free SAT during school on March 4th. Doing well on this particular SAT can count for an FSA concordant for graduation, and earn a qualifying score for college admission.

Current 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students:

The course selection sheets for scheduling next year's classes were distributed on February 12th and were due back on February 20th. Guidance counselors will be calling students down by their English classes to the BLC and will meet one on one regarding their course selections. This process will take approximately 3 weeks. Appointments in guidance are not necessary.

Students planning on dual enrollment for the first time should fill out their course selection sheet as if they were staying on FPC's campus. Once the student qualifies, and registers for dual enrollment, counselors will adjust their course selections. Returning full time dual enrollment students should check that box on the course selection sheet and follow the normal procedures to register for DSC classes.

Winter EOC & FSA Scores Are In

Winter End of Course exams and Florida State Assessments for biology, geometry, and US history courses are in. These assessments are worth 30% of the overall grade for the course. Students can pick up their score sheets from Laura Oliva, testing coordinator, in room 1153.

Flagler Palm Coast High School continues to strive to be an A school. This year, FPC is focusing on increasing literacy strategies in the classroom. The implementation of these strategies is increasing the academic achievement of our students, this is evident both in the classroom and on state testing.

FPC students outscored the state in biology, geometry, and US History. There was an 87% pass rate for our 9th grade biology students compared to the state pass rate of 85%. Geometry students had an overall pass rate of 86% compared to the states 69% pass rate for the same grade levels. US History 11th grade students earned a pass rate of 68% compared to the state pass rate of 66%. Congratulations to our young scholars for their hard work, and to the FPC teachers for continuing to provide superior instruction to our students.

Time for Spring Cleaning on your grades and attendance. FINISH STRONG!

The school year is flying by! Let's ALL start this semester with a clean slate. No matter how the fall semester ended, you now have an opportunity to improve your GPA and attendance. We encourage everyone to enjoy this chance for a fresh start by utilizing their time management skills to maintain good study habits and grades. Students, make sure to check your grades on Skyward and your school email daily. Please advocate for yourself. Teachers do not know you are concerned about your grades unless you let them know. Teachers want to see you succeed, make sure you have an open line of communication with each of them.

It is of paramount importance not only to pass all of your classes but to earn C's or higher. Simply earning D in class is almost as detrimental to your GPA as failing a class. Every student must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA to participate in athletics as well as to graduate with a diploma in four years. Earning all C's in each of your classes will keep you at a 2.0 GPA. Just one D or F will drop you below a 2.0 GPA. Do not allow yourself to slack off academically by not maintaining your grades the third nine weeks. A huge key to your success is daily attendance. Students who are absent from class tend to fall behind in their work and grades. Chronic absences can mean being absent as few as 4-5 days the first nine weeks. Be here, be on time, be prepared!

Students needing additional support in their core subject areas or in online classes have the opportunity to stay after school on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 2:25-4:25pm. After school buses are provided at 4:30pm for transportation home on these days. FPC also offers online tutoring Monday – Thursday anywhere you have WIFI.

The Access Project supports state-wide professional development to ensure a greater understanding of the Access Points (Access Points are academic expectations written specifically for students with significant cognitive disabilities). This training will help yield more effective instructional planning and teaching of academic content for our students with significant cognitive disabilities.

For the past 6 years and now well into our 7th, the i3 Academy at FPCHS has continued to grow and produce successful, well rounded students. This year's students have chosen to be a part of something special and take ownership in their learning. Our i3 students come from a variety of backgrounds and paths through their educational journey. They all have their own reasons for taking advantage of this unique learning opportunity and have set individual goals for themselves.

Often times if you ask someone on the outside what i3 is and who goes there, you hear comments like, "It's a technology school", "The students are secluded from FPC", "It's a smaller environment", and "Most students are very shy and quiet". While this may be their perception it's not actually the truth. At the i3 Academy we have students with a wide variety of personalities, academic levels, talents and interests. While our campus is located in one building on the FPC campus and offers a smaller learning environment, the i3 Academy and the students are very much a part of Flagler Palm Coast High School. Over 95% of our students take at least one course on the main campus. Numerous students are a part of our athletic programs like baseball, softball, track and field and cheer. We have students who also take part in the other FPC Flagships: the Fire Leadership Flagship and Aeronautics Flagship. Our students take part in clubs on the main campus and have the opportunity to attend all events held on the main campus. Several of our students are taking advantage of dual enrollment opportunities through Daytona State College and

Embry Riddle Aeronautical University. Upon completion of their high school careers we have had students that have headed to college, the military and even directly into the workforce.

From introverts to extroverts our students run the full gambit. Some common themes among the students that choose the i3 Academy, and stick with it over the years, are the desire to be in control of their education, a draw to project based learning and the development of soft skills, and a desire to be successful past the walls of high school. The connections they are making today in school and with the community are ones that can potentially change the path of their lives and is something we are very proud of.
