Let us not get complacent in either our daily attendance or our academics as we finish off the 2021 school year. Just as April showers and sunshine are the food and the nutrients for renewed and strong flowers, so too can be your preparation for your classes. If you tend to your academics and attendance NOW (like a garden) you will see the fruits of your labor in positive academic results (beautiful flowers) in May and June! Just like a race once you hit the homestretch you must finish strong and drive to the finish line (graduation). Now is not the time to let off the gas.

It is of paramount importance not only to pass all of your classes but to earn C's or higher. Simply earning D in class is almost as detrimental to your GPA as failing that class. Every student must maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA to participate in athletics as well as to graduate in four years. Earning all C's in each of your classes will keep you at a 2.0 GPA. Just one D or F will drop you below a 2.0 GPA. A huge key to your success is daily attendance. Students who are absent from class tend to fall behind in their work and grades. Chronic absences can mean being absent as few as 4-5 days. Be here, be on time, be prepared.

New IB Individual Courses


The IB Diploma Program at FPC is offering for the first time the excellent opportunity for students not in the program to take advantage of enrolling in accelerated academic courses that potentially earn them college credit. Introduced during the Programs of Study information night last March, these certificate courses are similar to Advanced Placement classes in that students can select the courses they wish to study without having to meet the core requirements of the IB Diploma Program. Designed with college-level rigor, these courses prepare students for post-secondary education and are recognized globally as meeting the requirements of most colleges and universities. Unlike AP courses, however, IB individual course students are tested in two ways: Externally through pen and paper exams in May and internally through projects, labs, essays, and oral recordings that generally occur halfway through the courses.

Currently IB at FPC offers individual courses in Biology; Chemistry; Computer Science; Music; Physics; Spanish; Sports, Exercise Science and Health; and Visual Arts. Students interested in any of these classes should meet with their guidance counselors as they complete their course selection for 2021-2022. Graduation

What to Wear with your Cap/Gown: EVERYONE will be required to wear face coverings during graduation. THERE ARE NO MEDICAL EXEMPTIONS. FPC will be providing all graduates with a mask to wear at graduation. All graduates will be wearing the same mask. The Ocean Center is requiring that everyone in the building wear a face covering at all times. If you are not wearing a face covering you will be asked to leave the building.

Graduates are **NOT** allowed to decorate caps. Please refrain from putting anything on top of your caps. Honor cords, stoles, medallions, or school related awards are the only things to be worn on top of your gown. All regalia must be received from FPCHS.




TESTING Information
