Bright Futures will continue to accept SAT and ACT scores through the June administrations of these exams. Get your community service hours to your counselor by May 15th! Remember, a minimum of 75 hours of community service hours is required for the Florida Medallion Scholars and 100 hours of community service hours is required for the Florida Academic Scholars.
