News from the Guidance Department

With the school year winding down and summer break right around the corner, it is a great time to be thinking about opportunities for community service. Students can use the community service hours to meet the Bright Futures requirements. As a reminder, the Bright Futures packets are in the counseling office and need to be approved prior to starting a service activity. Once the hours have been completed, the student will turn the packet into the counseling office with a letter on letterhead from the agency documenting the number of hours the student volunteered.

Bright Futures is a scholarship that is available to any student graduating from a Florida high school and can be used at any Florida college. The requirements to obtain the scholarship can be found in the Bright Futures Handbook: https://www.floridastudentfinancialaidsg.org/PDF/BFHandbookChapter1.pdf. Students may take the ACT and SAT in June after they have graduated to get a qualifying score. The community service hours must be completed by graduation of their senior year.

AP and IB exams are around the corner! If your son or daughter is in an AP or IB class the schedule will be posted soon on the Ft. Myers High School website.

A Few Reminders...

School Board Policy (4.16(3)(e)...

(e) Early Sign-Outs – Early sign-outs are defined as a parent or guardian signing out a child before the end of the school day.

- No student shall be released within the final 30 minutes of the school day unless the principal/designee determines it is an emergency.
- All schools shall establish procedures for early release that ensure that all students are treated consistently.
- Excessive early sign-outs will be addressed on a case-by-case basis to determine if there is a pattern of nonattendance.
- Unless excused under the provisions of this policy, accumulated early signouts will be recorded as unexcused absences.

New Entry Procedure for <u>ALL</u> Vistors to FMHS

During school hours all visitors must "ring" before entry.

- 1. Visitors must ring the doorbell
- 2. Identify yourself, provide reason for visit (Student's name, etc.)
- 3. Show a valid Photo ID (hold up to camera lens)
- 4. Please do not allow individuals not in your group to enter behind you

Search and Seizure

 If there is reason to believe that a student is concealing stolen or illegal property, alcohol, drugs, weapons, tobacco products or contraband, an administrator may search the student, locker and vehicle. Students found guilty of these infractions are subject to discipline consequences.

Out of Area

Student parking lots are off limits during both lunch shifts. If students are found in the parking lot during lunch without permission, student and vehicle will be searched.



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
