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






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#### **Academy of Finance**

Finance and Accounting students are preparing for their End of Course (EOC) Exams and working on Culminating Projects! Each student must complete a project demonstrating their understanding of key concepts covered in class. A more traditional End of Course Exam is also given to these students.

As an example, Accounting students play Monopoly and create a project including journal entries for their real-estate transactions during the game. The project combines fun and practical experience! In non-pandemic years, they visit FGCU to compete with other high schools in a Monopoly event!

All of our classes have been hybrid this year, allowing students who have chosen to study from home to participate. While this is challenging, our students remain engaged and learning! We are looking forward to next year with hopes that we are all back in the classroom together!

Students considering one or more of our Academy classes may include them in their course selection for next year. The normal progression of classes is Economic and Financial Services (10th grade), Accounting Applications (11th grade) and Personal Financial Planning (12th grade). To graduate with the Academy, students must complete these classes along with an internship. However, students are welcome to take one or two classes without graduating with the Academy.

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

## **Stem At Work**


