Clinic **Isolation Room Process**

To ensure we are following the district's process for the isolation room, our FMHS process for the Isolation Room is as follows:

- Student informs staff of illness. 1.
- 2. Staff member contacts the clinic and sends the student to the clinic **Student will CASTLE out if they are able to do so.
- 3. Clinic staff will follow the district protocol and question the student regarding symptoms.
- If the clinic staff believes the student has 4. COVID-19 symptoms, the student will be sent to the isolation room and documented within CDMS.
- 5. Upon entry to the room the isolation room staff will document the student's information using the Isolation Room Log
- 6. Isolation room staff will contact the parent informing them that the student has been placed in isolation and request that the student is picked-up immediately (document exit time).
- Isolation room staff will provide the parent 7. with the district information regarding procedures to follow for safe return to campus (in the isolation room).
- 8. Once the student has left the room/ campus, the CLINIC will send an email to our principal's secretary and Dr. Butz stating the following: Please review the Isolation Room Log.
- 9. Attendance code (GC) will be added to Focus by attendance clerk at the request of administration.


**Administration will be contacted when a parent is unable to provide transportation or does not pick-up their child in a timely manner. Also, students are allowed to drive themselves home if the parent provides you with an authorization.

These procedures are a work in progress and may change as new information is received from the district. Please remember that we are all bond by HIPA regulations, therefore no information within the log may be shared verbally or written.

School Sign Out Policy

Our school policy regarding early student signout is as follows:

- Per the School District of Lee County Policy 4.16 students may not be signedout after 1:05 PM. Guardians who are not listed on the student's school records as an authorized contact will not be permitted to sign the student out of school.
- Students signing out prior to 1:05 PM must be verified by FMHS Attendance Office.
- For students who drive to school email requests for early sign-out must be submitted <u>no later than 8:00 AM</u> on the day of sign-out request. The email must include a legible copy of the guardian's identification along with contact information for verification. This will allow the staff sufficient time to verify the signout request.
- Students who do not drive to school must have a parent sign them out for early release.



Model United Nations Parents/Guardians & Students

I would like to introduce myself. I am Debra Dailidonis and I am the teacher who has accepted the opportunity to work as the Model UN sponsor. A few years back, I chose to sponsor Model UN because the club *desperately* needed an on-campus sponsor, and since that time have never looked back! Working with Model UN students is one of the highlights of my week and I am looking forward to working with veteran members as well as our new members this year!

To start, to be a member in good standing as well as attend the conferences, students are required to pay dues (\$20.00) and attend/participate on a regular basis. In addition, members in good standing can earn CAS hours for their participation in Model UN. Specific CAS hours are to be determined by me and the CAS coordinator.

On the back of this letter are the meeting dates for the first semester, and a list of conferences the executive board has suggested we attend. The conferences are NOT mandatory for students who would like to participate in Model UN, especially considering the cost involved. However, if you choose to run for an executive board position for next year, you must attend at least one. We will be conducting fundraisers to help offset the costs of the conferences; nevertheless, I feel it is important to be up-front about the approximate out-of-pocket expense you will have to pay for each one. I would HIGHLY suggest that you consider the cost, as well as the date (check your calendars!), before committing to a conference as some conference deposits cannot be refunded. If you are new to Model UN, I would suggest attending one of the local conferences first before attending a more costly one out of the area.

Students may drive to local conferences; however, they are not permitted to carry other students in their vehicles. For the trips to St. Augustine and Gainesville, we will need parents to drive. In order to drive, I will need a copy of your driver's license and insurance, as well as the make and model of your car. A list of "prohibited vehicles" has been issued by Lee County Schools, and these vehicles cannot be used to transport students. A quick way to know if your vehicle may be one of them is to check your driver-side visor where most cars publish a roll over warning. If there is a warning label, the vehicle is not permitted for student transportation. Thanks ahead of time for any parents who would consider driving (and chaperoning) out-of-area trips! We will use funds we have in our established account to help off-set the costs of gas and hotel expenses.

Please do not hesitate to call or email me if you have any questions. I may not know the answer to your questions right away, but will do everything I can to find out the answer in a timely manner.

CASTLE

Students will use Castle dashboard for the following affairs this year:

- Castle In/Out for passes
- Bus list
- Student information (data, grades, etc.)

Google Classroom

Grade level classrooms are used for school counselor request.

Parent Portal /E-FORMS

All parents/guardians must register the Focus Parent Portal as well as complete student directory information and student health information. These online forms must be completed each year even if no information has changed.

- Attendance Policy/Integrity Form/Bully Form/Code of Conduct Form
- Agree to follow all COVID requirements stated by School District of Lee County. www.leeschools.net.

Discipline

- Please refer to FOCUS discipline along with the district code of conduct for more detailed explanations of rules, rights and responsibilities.
- While Electronic devices are permitted in school, the use of such devices during instructional time is not allowed. This extends to use of ETDs in hallways, offices, RR, and other areas as well.
- For minor infractions (Level 1 and some Level 2), students will be tracked as minor infractions in FOCUS set up with different protocols for each offense and occurrence of offense. Escalating up in each incident could result in a referral and discipline action being taken by administration. Students that escalate to referral status will adhere to district code of conduct guidelines.

Parking Permits

- Sold in Student Affairs
- Parking Permits can be purchased at FMHS before school from 8-2 or in Student Affairs during the school day.
- Cost of parking permits is \$50
 - » Completed GOOGLE FORM
 - Students must have valid Driver's License
 - » Students must bring a copy of: vehicle registration, insurance card and driving form with parent signature

*Students should purchase parking decal in Student Affairs BEFORE 1st bell of day or during scheduled lunch to purchase parking permit

Breakfast and Lunch Procedures

- Breakfast will be grab and go at 6 stations positioned around campus. Students will visit one of the grab and go areas grab his/her breakfast then MUST report to their 1st block classroom.
- Lunch will be grab and go stationed in the cafeteria. Lunches will be consumed in specified areas while practicing social distancing. All students must practice social distancing while at lunch. Fort Myers High will be a part the "Community Eligibility Program" for the upcoming 2020-2021 school year. All students will receive breakfast and lunch at no cost. Students MUST sit in a seat marked with a BLUE X. The BLUE X is to ensure social distancing. These will be located throughout campus.
- While we encourage students to participate in the free lunch program at school, be advised that lunch CANNOT be delivered to school during instructional time.

Hallways

Hallways on FMHS campus will be labeled as one-way hallways. Students must follow directional arrows as well as maintaining social distancing.

Restroom Usage

Due to social distancing requirements the restrooms will not be open during class change. Students will be allowed to use the restroom during classes.

Dress Code

- Mask are to be worn at all time while on campus with the exception of while eating breakfast/Lunch.
- All skirts worn should be fingertip length/ bottoms should not have any skin exposed, rips or frays and should be worn at the waist with a belt, if necessary
- Shorts- MUST be worn at the hip and be to the knee in length.
- Leggings may be worn with a top covering the buttock area. They must not be made of transparent material.
- Sleeveless, bare mid -drift, transparent, or any top depicting illegal substances, inappropriate pictures, messages, etc. are prohibited.
- All shirts/tops must be worn at the waist line.

Hall Pass Process

At the start of the 2020-21 school year students will be given training on the use of CASTLE as it pertains to hall passes. <u>Requesting a hall pass is the students'</u> <u>responsibility</u>. Students will be given three hall passes per day. A student who leaves the classroom MUST:

- Ask for teacher permission to leave classroom.
- CASTLE out of class by logging into Castle on his/her Chromebook. The correct time the student left the classroom will appear on screen and begin a timer.
- NOT use electronic devices (cell phones, IPods, headphones, games, etc.) at any time while out of classroom.

A student who returns to the classroom MUST:

 CASTLE in to class upon return so that Castle can stop timer and track student back in class.

Must have a signed pass with the date and time if returning from the Clinic, Main Office, Media Center, or another teacher.



Lee County's **FOCUS Parent Portal** provides parents/guardians a real-time view of their child's assignment grades, attendance information, current grade averages in all classes, as well as progress monitoring results.

- You will need a Student ID, Birth Date, and Portal PIN for each student account you wish to add.
- Note that the student Portal PIN will be emailed to the Parent's email address on file. If you did not receive this PIN, contact your child's school.
- Enter the information in all the required fields and click "Add Student" to create your account.
- Your student's account is now linked to your parent portal account.
- To add another child, click I would like to ADD A CHILD who is already enrolled." Enter all the information required and click Add Student. (Note that this step can be completed as many times as necessary, or later, if needed).
- Otherwise, click "I am Finished Adding Students Please take me to the Portal"

**Note in the future you will need to use the username provided, and the password you create to access your portal again.
