

*GJHS Financial Aid Night/FAFSA & Bright Futures lab* – Tuesday, October 19th in the GJHS Food Court from 6:00 – 7:30 pm. Seniors and their parents should come ready to complete the free federal financial aid application and a financial aid advisor will be available to help. Over \$24 billion of financial aid goes unclaimed each year. Seniors, don't miss this opportunity to get your financial aid process started!

*GJHS Senior Night:* On **September 22nd,** we held our first annual Senior Night. Links to the information presented at this meeting will be on our website. Students and parents received information on graduation, senior activities, yearbooks, college application process, post-secondary planning and financial aid. When the time/date is selected, the student will receive a confirmation email that can be used as a pass to attend the conference. **Parent Night for Freshmen & Sophomores** – Tues, Oct 5th 6:00 – 7:00 pm: Our School Counselors are hosting a Zoom parent night for 9th and 10th grade students & parents. Mark the calendar for Tuesday, October 5th and join this Zoom meeting for information on graduation requirements, post-secondary planning, grade point averages, high school courses, and making the most of the high school experience. **Juniors:** Individual junior conferences will take place in the spring. For now, sign up for the PSAT!!! It will provide the best test preparation to start taking the SAT & ACT in the spring. 
Juniors & Sophomores: PSAT is coming, October 13th!! The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholar Qualifying Test) will be administered on Wednesday, October 13th at GJHS during 1st and 3rd periods. The PSAT, from the College Board, the same company that creates the SAT and AP, is a comprehensive program that helps put students on the path to college. It measures critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills and is the best indicator of how a student will perform on the SAT. This test is important to juniors as it is the only qualifying test for National Merit Scholarship Programs. Taking the PSAT gives students access to SAT practice with College Board and Khan Academy. This test preparation is free and personalized based on the PSAT results. All sophomores will be tested without fees. Juniors (who have met the Algebra EOC requirement) are required to register and pay for this test with Ms. Sengsouvanna in Room 1151. Payment of \$18.00, check, cash or money order, must be received upon registration. Please bring exact change or make checks payable to GJHS. 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# Testing Information Information for Upcoming Tests

By the time you read this we will be wrapping up Fall FSA ELA and EOC testing. Test results should come in before Winter break. When scores are released they will be uploaded and available in the Parent and Student Portals within two weeks of receipt. Instructions to access your scores can be found on the GJ website under "Important Links".

The PSAT/NMSQT will be administered once this year on October 13th. All sophomores will be scheduled for this test. In addition, the District will be paying for all juniors and seniors who have not met their Algebra EOC graduation requirement. A score of 430 on the Math section will satisfy this requirement. Any Freshman who has taken but not passed the Algebra EOC may request to take the PSAT/NMSQT and pay the \$18 test fee. In addition, any junior who would like to take the PSAT/NMSQT to compete for a National Merit Scholarship may also pay the \$18 fee and request to test. You may send your request to sarah.sengsouvanna@polk-fl.net to register.

The ACT School Day NCR (non-college reportable) test will be administered to all seniors who have not yet met their ELA or Algebra EOC graduation requirements. There is no fee and no registration required. No other students may take this test. All students will be provided triple time. No College Board approved accommodations will be allowed. Tests must be taken in order. English - October 19; Math - October 20; Reading – October 21.


# GJQ
