Juniors & Sophomores: PSAT is coming, October 12th!!!

The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/ National Merit Scholar Qualifying Test) will be administered on Wednesday, October 12th at GJHS during 1st and 3rd periods. The PSAT, from the College Board, the same company that creates the SAT and AP, is a comprehensive program that helps put students on the path to college. It measures critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills and is the best indicator of how a student will perform on the SAT. This test is important to juniors as it is the

only qualifying test for National Merit Scholarship Programs. Taking the PSAT gives students access to SAT practice with College Board and Khan Academy. This test preparation is free and personalized based on the PSAT results. All sophomores will be tested without fees. Juniors (who have met the Algebra EOC requirement) are required to register and pay for this test with Mrs. Heady in Room 1151. Payment of \$18.00, check, cash or money order, must be received upon registration. Please bring exact change or make checks payable to GJHS. Our GJHS Chapter of the National English Honor Society held their first meeting of the fall semester on Thursday, September 1, 2022. After following up a year of drastic growth and blooming community service participation, the officers – President Emma Abdoney; First Vice President, Sarah Ceranic; Second Vice President, Nolan Fernandez; Third Vice President/Secretary, Kelly Granger; Treasurer, Lydia Shi; Historian, Colton McManus; and Parliamentarian, Nalanie Davila, along with their sponsor, Mrs. Barr – have set major goals for this school year's NEHS Chapter.

Among the Chapter goals for 22-23 includes continuing the abundant and frequent participation in community service, both on and off George Jenkins' campus. Last year, our Chapter was able to donate 117 pairs of socks to George's Closet during *Socktoberfest*, aid in the formation of three Thanksgiving baskets, of which Spanish Honor Society received, donate both hard and paperback books to the *Little Book Bus*, and donate gifts for our *Adopt-a-Christmas-Child*. The Chapter plans to participate in all these activities again with the addition of a few new projects.

One new project is the creation of a school wide Lego drive, which aims to collect used Legos, which will then be repackaged and sent

Tutoring will be offered every Wednesday and Thursday from 2:05–2:35 PM.

The NEHS's main desire for the 22-23 year is to double in size, as we currently hold 32 members, with hopes of ending the spring semester with over 64 members. The Chapter has already grown with the addition of a sponsor and new staff member, Ms. Gant.



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


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
