Juniors & Sophomores: PSAT is coming, October 18th!!!

The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholar Qualifying Test) will be administered on Wednesday, October 18th at GJHS during 1st and 3rd periods. The PSAT, from the College Board, the same company that creates the SAT and AP, is a comprehensive program that helps put students on the path to college. It measures critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills and is the best indicator of how a student will perform on the SAT. This test is important to juniors as it is the only qualifying test for National Merit Scholarship Programs. Taking the PSAT gives students access to SAT practice with College Board and Khan Academy. This test preparation is free and personalized based on the PSAT results. All sophomores will be tested without fees. Juniors are required to register and pay for this test. Payment of \$18.00, check, cash, or money order, must be received upon registration. Please bring exact change or make checks payable to GJHS. Seniors-

On September 12th, we held our annual Senior Night. Links to the information presented at this meeting are on the Senior Information portion of the GJHS website. Students and parents received information on graduation, senior activities, yearbooks, college application process, post-secondary planning, and financial aid. For the most up to date information, refer to the 'Class of 2024 Senior Information' link under Announcements on the main page of our website.

Senior conferences will take place during the month of October. Students should refer to their school email for a link to sign up for their preferred date and time. When the time/date is selected, the student will receive a confirmation email that can be used as a pass to attend the conference. Please review the Senior Conference Packet on the Student Services section of the GJHS website to see what will be discussed and have your questions ready to ask your counselor.

FAFSA opens later this year on December 1st. Our annual Financial Aid Night will take place in December. Seniors and their parents should plan to attend and be ready to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and a college financial aid advisor will be there to help.

Graduation Requirements

<u>All students</u> are required to earn 24 credits to earn a high school diploma including:

- 4 English (ELA)
- 4 Math (must include Algebra and Geometry)
- 3 Science (must include Biology)
- 3 Social Studies (1 World History, 1 US History, .5 Government, .5 Economics)
- 1 Physical Education (.5 Personal Fitness AND .5 any other PE OR 1 credit in HOPE)
- 1 Practical/Performing Art
- 8 electives
- Maintain a 2.0 un-weighted cumulative GPA.

State Assessment Requirements: will update with legislation changes

- Grade 10 ELA (or ACT/SAT concordant score)
- Algebra I end-of-course (EOC) or comparative score on SAT, ACT, PSAT, or Geometry EOC

Students must participate in the EOC assessments and the results constitute 30 percent of the final course grade. These assessments are in the following subjects:

Algebra I, Geometry, U.S. History, Biology I

Scholar Diploma Designation: In addition to meeting the 24-credit standard high school diploma requirements, a student must:

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra II
- Pass the Geometry EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- Pass the Biology I EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
- Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC
- Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- Earn at least 1 credit in AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course

A student is exempt from the Biology I or U.S. History assessment if the student is enrolled in an AP Biology or U.S. History course and the student takes the respective AP, IB or AICE assessment and earns the minimum score to earn college credit.

Industry Scholar Diploma Designation:

- Meet the standard high school diploma requirements
- Attain one or more industry certifications from the list established (per s. 1003.492, F.S.)

State University Admissions Requirements

Florida universities have a competitive admissions process. The MINIMUM eligibility requirements for admissions are as follows:

Earn a standard diploma with a minimum 2.5 GPA in 18 academic courses which include:


- 4 English
- 4 Math (Algebra 1 and higher-level courses)
- 3 Science
- 3 Social Studies
- 2 Foreign Language (in the same language)
- 2 Academic electives

Earn competitive scores on national college entrance exams:

SAT or ACT

However, students only earning minimum requirements will not gain admissions to most Florida universities. These schools are also looking for a rigorous curriculum, strong GPA with an upward trend, competitive test scores, a well written essay, a passionate commitment to extracurricular activities, and leadership experiences. Each school accepts their most competitive applicants. QUICK TESTING EXPECTATIONS

Testing Expectations

- Students are required to bring their school issued computer updated AND fully charged to testing. If they do not bring their computer, they will not be able to test on their assigned date. It is highly recommended that they bring their charger as well. Note, not all tests in the Fall have make up days incorporated into schedule due to time restraints.
- 2. Testing date, time & room location lists will be sent out to staff; it is the staff's responsibility to check the lists for their students and inform them of their testing location, date and time. If there is a sub it is imperative a list is provided to them within the sub plans or arrangements made with a neighboring staff member. Please review the list with all your period classes to ensure testing students are informed.
- 3. Staff Training Date/Dates forth coming. Mandatory documents to sign.
- 4. PLEASE utilize the practice tests for ALL students testing. Students need to understand how the functions/ testing accommodations work. (More directions will be forth coming on how you as a TA can actually practice getting your sessions started within your classrooms while they complete the practice test) ALL teachers will be involved in testing.
- 5. Teachers assigned as Test Administrators must have their accounts set up PRIOR to the day of testing. Paperwork must be returned in the tubs in the order received with ALL documents filled out completely & correctly; otherwise we will have to move to a pickup/drop off system versus delivery. Holding room Teachers MUST have students sign in (print their names so it is legible) as proof of attendance and returned to assigned teachers to enter in to FOCUS.




