STUDENT PARKING

Students must complete this form and pay the \$10 fee prior to parking on campus.

All students who drive on campus must have a hanging parking permit in their vehicle. Student parking permits can be purchased for \$10 from Ms. Gilbert in the magnet office.

All students are required to park in the 31st Street lot. Students who are enrolled in dual enrollment classes at St. Petersburg College or Pinellas Technical College are permitted to park in the 34th Street lot in the spaces closest to the football field with a special permit. Parking in the 31st Street is on a first come first serve basis.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS

Parents requesting early check out of their student should call the school at 727-893-5452 ext. 2000 for the student to get a permit to leave slip. If you come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. It is important that we check driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. Anyone picking up a

student should be on the students Focus record. This is done to ensure the safety of the student. After 1:25 pm there will be no student dismissals from school.



BRIGHT FUTURES VOLUNTEER SERVICE/PAID WORK

- > To be eligible to receive one of the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Awards, students must complete either volunteer service hours or paid work hours.
- ➤ Beginning with the class of 2023, students may now use work hours in lieu of service hours.
- > Service and work hours cannot be combined.
- ➤ Both work and service hours must be completed with an agency, company, organization or business where they can be verified.
- > Students must be in high school (summer before 9th grade acceptable).

December/January

- MOST Applications should be complete
- Complete and submit your community service hours by January of your graduating year.
- ➤ Florida Virtual School Grades due for graduation requirements
- ➤ Make any necessary schedule changes for graduation requirements ONLY
- Request Mid-year transcript/report in Naviance by January 31st

College Application Steps

- ➤ Register with and Create a Common App Account at CommonApp.org
- ➤ On Common App:
 - Add High School Information
 - Add at least one college
 - Review and Accept FERPA Release Authorization
- ➤ Match your Common App account to Naviance
- Add any non-Common App colleges to Naviance "Colleges I'm Applying To" list
- Select application method and deadline for all non-Common App colleges
- Request materials for ALL college applications in Naviance
 - Transcripts
 - Letters of Recommendation
