

#### Media Center News

The media center has been a very busy place over the first semester and that trend is continuing into semester two. So far this year we have checked out over 1300 more books than we did all of last year! This leads to reading gains which historically show as higher test scores. Reading just 20 minutes a day dramatically increases students' vocabulary and thinking skills.

Students are using the media center in the morning for homework help, building relationships playing board games, improving their thinking with STEM materials, puzzles, and reading. Our 3D printers are gaining users as well as giving students experience with troubleshooting mistakes and technical issues. We have added an Audrino starter kit for students to learn to code and make electronics work. More circuit boards and materials will be added as the budget allows.







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## Service Learning

**Service Learning** students finished A Long Walk to Water, which we read as part of a unit studying Africa. We also participated in a Skype call with a scientist in Nairobi to learn about life and students that attend the Kathy and Mike McNulty Academy. We will be holding a fundraiser with the Service Learning classes competing against each other to raise money to help support these students at the school. Next we'll be reading I Will Always Write Back. We will also participate in "Say Something Week" in late February to encourage people to speak up when they see others struggling to work toward preventing violence.

## 7th Grade Language Arts

During third quarter, 7th Grade **Language Arts** classes have been reading a play, poetry, and historical accounts of events and people. Students have been analyzing multimedia versions of texts and comparing and contrasting the effectiveness on the audience. Third quarter will conclude with students participating in Writing Workshop to prepare for the Writing portion of the ELA FSA in April. Daily homework continues to be reading a book of choice and completing book projects. Don't forget to get a book to continue reading if you don't have one!

#### Science 6

Students in Mr. Rose's Life Science Class had opportunity to dissect Owl Pellets (Owl Vomit) in class. After learning about ecosystems, food chains, and predator prey relationships they were able to dissect apart their pellets and discover what creature(s) the owl ate. They then had to piece the bones together according to anatomical charts and glue the bones down to form a skeleton of the prey on a notecard. Science... coming alive!

## 1th Grade PLTWISTEM

The 6th grade PLTW/STEM class has been working on designing and constructing paper roller coasters for marbles. Students spent two weeks studying force and energy in relation to roller coasters as well as common design principles. Engineering teams then designed a three foot tall roller coaster meeting a specific set of constraints. Roller coasters were tested on January 30th for adherence to constraints and originality. Overall, the students thoroughly enjoyed the planning, building, and testing of their coasters. Our next unit of study is focused around the topic of Medical Detectives and students will be studying vital signs, pathogenic illness, the nervous system (including a brain dissection), and basic forensics.








## All County Band

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
