Virtual Library Card



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## sth Grade US History

We are moving into independence. The colonists have realized that they are no longer going to be bullied by the treacherous King George III. They have had enough of the



unfair taxes. The Second Continental Congress has the authority to coin money, raise an army (Continental Army), and start a post office. Paul Revere and Samuel Dawes were notified that the British were coming. They then rode off into the night to warn the colonists that they were on their way. 
