From The Principal's Desk

Dear Shark Families,

As we come to the end of the 2018-19 academic year at Gulf Coast High School, it is a good time to reflect on what we have achieved, update you on some important changes and look forward to another amazing school year in 2019-2020.

First, I am very proud that the school has achieved a school grade of an "A" for the 7th year in a row. We have and will continue to make improvements in our quality of instruction. Our students have endless opportunities to find their sense of belonging whether it be through our activities, clubs, or sports.

New Roof: As you are aware, Gulf Coast is going through a bit of a remodel. Currently, a new roof is being installed on all of our buildings in the front of the school, with the hope that all of the back of the school buildings will begin construction this summer. The entire project is expected to be completed next school year.

Interior Paint: The entire interior of the school will be painted this summer. No longer will we have some hallways and classrooms that do not represent Gulf Coast High School colors. This includes the gymnasium and auditorium.

Safety and Security: We are in the process of replacing all exterior locks to all doors on our campus and installing card readers that automatically open doors for all school personnel with their ID Badge. We have been replacing school cameras with higher quality cameras. We will continue the practice of at least one Code Red drill a month for our staff and students.

Time Capsule: We are going to start collecting items to put in a time capsule that will be displayed in the Media Center to be opened in 10 years. We will be working with student groups and faculty to put items in the capsule. We will send out more information about our display in upcoming newsletters.

May Testing: With the new testing calendar released by the state, the month of May is a very busy month on our campus. Almost every AICE and AP exam, as well as all state testing will occur in the month of May. With over 2,370 students, attendance is critical as we finish the home stretch of the school year.

Again, I want to thank all parents and community members that help make Gulf Coast the great school that it has become. It has been a pleasure and an honor to be the principal for the last six years. I hope that everyone has a summer break filled with new adventures and opportunities to spend with family and friends and I look forward to another amazing school year in 2019 – 2020.

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14 Summer Activities to Boost Your College Application



Testing Accommodation for Students with Disabilities

A student with a documented disability may be eligible for accommodations on national college exams including ACT, SAT, PSAT, AP, and/or Certification Exams including Adobe, Microsoft, Autodesk, QuickBooks and ServSafe Exam.

ACT and SAT Accommodation Request must be started early and the request process may take up to seven (7) weeks and does not begin until all required documentation are received. For guidelines and documentation requirements see the following testing links:

Summer break is fast approaching and with that, the class of 2019 will be going to college, work, or the armed services, etc... With change comes new responsibilities. In addition, new freedoms.

Here are a few things to remember:

- If you are going to college and you have a chronic medical condition like asthma, diabetes or a life-threatening allergy that requires an Epi-pen tell your roommate and the RA. Show your roommate and the RA how to use a glucagon or Epipen. Also, check-in with the on-campus student health services. At work, let your supervisor know about your emergency medication and show them how to use it. If you have a medical condition that is chronic, create an emergency phone number list of your doctors, family and friends that should be contacted. If you need to use a nebulizer, keep in mind your roommate may never have seen one before. Show them how it works and keep in an easy to reach spot.
- Make sure you are up-to-date on required vaccinations for college and that you have a current physical on file. Also, ask the doctor what boosters you may need, and make copies of your immunizations. The college will need a copy and your parents should keep a copy.
- Have a medical supply box on hand with the following:
 - A digital thermometer, Ibuprofen or Acetaminophen, cold and flu medication, Band-Aid's in different sizes, antibiotic ointment, and if you wear glasses, an eyeglass repair kit.

Remember if you have a fever go to the on-campus student health services!

- · Marvin Jean Denis won the shot put





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
