Dual Enrollment

Sophomores and Juniors who are interested in dual enrollment for the next school year need to meet with their counselor for specific details and requirements. Information regarding dual enrollment is posted on the Canvas Counseling Corner.

Students who meet all the requirements for FGCU's program (GPA and SAT/ACT scores) please email your counselors. The deadline for FGCU dual enrollment is March 31, 2022. Students should email their counselor to discuss FSW dual enrollment before March 31st, 2022. Registering for FSW courses will begin in late March.

Volunteer/Community Service

All hours for volunteer/community service must be pre-approved by the student service staff at lunch. This policy will be strictly enforced. Each student must obtain prior approval to ensure that the community service site meets the criteria and that the student will receive community service for volunteering. The forms can be found on the website or in the guidance office.

Bright Futures Scholarships

Seniors must complete a Florida Financial Aid Scholarship Application to be considered for a Bright Futures Scholarship. Counselors assisted seniors with this application process through open labs scheduled through the Government classes in October. Dual Enrollment students can use the website and complete it at home or come into the guidance office.

Testing Accommodation for Students with Disabilities

A student with a documented disability may be eligible for accommodations on national college exams including ACT, SAT, PSAT, AP, and/or Certification Exams including Adobe, Microsoft, Autodesk, QuickBooks, and ServSafe Exam.

ACT and SAT Accommodation Requests must be started early. The request process may take up to seven (7) weeks and the decision determination does not begin until all required documentation is received.
