

#### **Testing** Accommodation for Students with **Disabilities**

A student with a documented disability may be eligible for accommodations on national college exams including ACT, SAT, PSAT, AP, and/or Certification Exams including Adobe, Microsoft, Autodesk, QuickBooks, and ServSafe Exam.

ACT and SAT Accommodation Requests must be started early. The request process may take up to seven (7) weeks and the decision determination does not begin until all required documentation is received.

Students must meet requirements and deadlines before registering for classes at Florida Southwestern College or Florida Gulf Coast University.

Florida Gulf Coast University has a selection process for its Accelerated Collegiate Experience program. Please schedule an appointment with your counselor for FGCU by February 1, 2022. #### **GCHS** Athletics Department

As the Fall Season comes to an end and the Winter Season is now upon us, I thought I'd share some highlights from the Fall Season:

- Boys Golf (Region, District, CCAC Champs) made it to the State Finals in Howey in the Hills. Junior Noah Kent (Iowa Commit) finished tied for 2nd and is a State Runner-up.
- Girls Golf (Region Runner-up, District, CCAC Champs) finished their season in 3rd place at State Finals in Howey in the Hills. The girl's 3rd place finish is the best finish for a girls golf team in Collier County History!
- Boys Cross Country (State Finals Appearance) Sophomore Will Montanye finished 69th at the State Finals, and the boy's team finished 27th overall at the State Finals in Tallahassee.
- **Girls Cross Country (Regional Appearance)** our Lady Sharks placed 2nd at the CCAC and finished 4 points shy of a State Finals appearance in the toughest region in the state.
- Swim/Dive (CCAC Champs, State Runner-up, State Medalist) The Sharks had an amazing year in which they retained THE LOG and had 9 Sharks represent Collier County at the 4A State Meet in Stuart. Jack Stokvis placed 2nd in the 100 Butterfly with a tie of his school-record time of 48.63, which earned him Automatic All-American. Carinn Bethea placed 4th in the 200 Free and 7th in the 500 free. The Sharks 200 Free Relay team also placed 7th in 4A. Junior Sofia Licausi finished 12th in the 4A Dive Finals. Freshman Clayton Shephard finished 15th in the 4A dive Finals.
- Volleyball (CCAC Champs, District Runner-Up) finished with an overall record of 18-10 and finished as District Runner-up. The Sharks went 9-0 to sweep the CCAC conference. Junior Lily Lucas finished with 293 kills and Sophomore Aisha Keric with 264 kills.
- **Football (2nd in CCAC)** won the CatFish Bowl for the 2nd in 3 years. Junior Quarterback Konner Barrett, Junior Reciever Joseph Miller, Senior Linebacker Quinn Hepler finished as the leading SWFL statistics for this position.
