Second Semester

Determine if any supplies or devices are needed. Also, monitor your student's grades, attendance, and classwork by accessing *Parent Portal*- https://portal.collierschools.com/live/?.

Learn what tutoring and support opportunities are available here at school to improve results. Again, your attention to your student's schoolwork will have a tremendous positive effect. When students are prepared for class each day, they will attend each day, arrive on time, and perform with confidence. 

Accommodations Request

Testing Accommodation for **Students with Disabilities**

A student with a documented disability may be eligible for accommodations on national college exams including ACT, SAT, PSAT, AP, and/or Certification Exams including Adobe, Microsoft, Autodesk, QuickBooks and ServSafe Exam.

ACT and SAT Accommodation Request must be started early and the request process may take up to seven (7) weeks and does not begin until all required documentation are received.


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Spanish Academic Team

Shark Swimming and Diving Team

The Shark Swimming and Diving Team finished their season with a great showing at the State 4A meet. The road was hard as the post season progressed with lots of new, faster competition in the higher class. The girls finished runner-up in the district, 4th in the region and 10th in the state. The boys finished 3rd in the district, 7th in the region and 31st with one swimmer at states. The girls' state team consisted of 2 relays, 6 individual swims and 1 diver. Team members included Carinn Bethea. Danielle Boland, Brooke Boling, Sophia Licausi, Rachel Moran, and Olivia Owens. Both relays medaled (4th and 6th) and Rachel Moran took home an individual 6th place in the 100 breaststroke breaking her own school record. On the boys' side, freshman Jack Stokvis represented the sharks well placing 6th in the 100 fly in new school record time and 14th in

the 50 free. Now that we have seen our new competition, it only makes us want to work harder in the pool. Congrats to all on a great season.



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IROTC Raider Competition

The Gulf Coast High School JROTC Shark Battalion has had a busy year thus far. The Raider teams have competed in three Raider competitions. The first Raider competition was the Collier County Raider Competition. Both male and female Raider teams placed first at the county competition earning them a trip to the state competition. For the first time, the mixed Raider team placed second during the county competition. The second Raider competition was held at Lake Wales, Florida, where the Gulf Coast High School male and female Raiders competed against teams from across the entire state. Congratulations to the female team for placing second in the state and males for placing fourth. The last Raider competition was held at Myakka City, Florida, where four Gulf Coast High School male (two person teams) and three female (two person teams) competed against teams from Florida and Georgia. On 6 December, the Shark Battalion was evaluated during the JROTC Program Accreditation (JPA). This is the most strenuous event that the battalion will endure and only occurs once every five years. Once again, the Shark Battalion has achieved the highest rating of "Honor Unit of Distinction". Now that Raider season and JPA are over, the Shark Battalion will begin Drill Team practice. The cadets will participate in weekly training to hone their skills for the upcoming Collier County Drill Competition that is being held at Gulf Coast High School on February 22nd. The cadets will compete in 12 different categories of drill in hopes of earning a trip to the Florida State Drill Competition that will be held on April 18th. Simultaneously, the JROTC Leadership and Academic Bowl (JLAB) Teams will be competing in rounds one and two. Both JLAB Teams have advanced to round two that will be held between 1-15 February. Of the 1,700 JROTC programs in the nation, only 24 JLAB Academic and 40 JLAB Leadership Teams will advance to the National Championship in Washington, D.C. The JLAB Teams are working extremely hard to earn their fifth trip to the National JLAB Competition.
