## Early Dismissal/Absence Calls

Please leave a message on (239)377-1500 for all students who will be absent, note this is <u>a message only</u> <u>line</u>, the attendance office staff will retrieve and update your child's record.

All students who need to be released early from school will be required to provide a parent note or call. All calls for early dismissal can be made to (239)377-1431 making sure to provide the student number, name, and time for release. All notes for early dismissal need to be dropped off to the attendance office first thing in the morning, a valid phone number for the parent/guardian must be on the note. A phone call from a staff member will be made to the parent/guardian, students will not be released until proper verification has been made. Parents who provide their child with a note for early release may also call (239)377-1431 and leave a message the night before.

## **Seniors and College Admissions**

## SAT and ACT Testing

Seniors who have not yet taken an SAT or ACT should register ASAP. ACT has added additional test dates in September and October for students.

Students can send SAT and ACT scores to colleges directly from the College Board (collegeboard. com) or the ACT (act.org) websites.

Students can request transcripts to be sent to colleges by emailing Ms. Lopez at lopezan@ collierschools.com. Make sure to include your name and student ID number in the email.

#### **Financial Aid**

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will be available for the 2021-2022 school year beginning October 1, 2020. This application is required to be eligible for PELL Grants and other federal administered funds. Students and parents can visit fafsa.gov for more information.

The Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) will also be available for the 2021-2022 school year beginning October 1, 2020. This application is required to be eligible for Bright Futures and other state-administered funds. Students can visit www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/ssfad/bf for more information.

#### **Local Scholarships**

The Community Foundation of Collier County maintains a scholarship list for CCPS students at https://www.swflscholarships.org/. Seniors should check this list regularly starting late in the fall for information on scholarship opportunities.

### **Testing Accommodation for Students with Disabilities**

A student with a documented disability may be eligible for accommodations on national college exams including ACT, SAT, PSAT, AP, and/or Certification Exams including Adobe, Microsoft, Autodesk, QuickBooks, and ServSafe Exam.

ACT and SAT Accommodation Request must be started early and the request process may take up to seven (7) weeks and does not begin until all required documentation is received.

#### **To Login Using Your Email Address**

- If your email address is on file or if you have registered your student using the online centralized registration, you may log in to the Parent Portal using this email address.
- Your password is either your student's 6 digit student ID or the password you created when registering your student on the online centralized registration system.

## To Login Using Your Mobile Phone Number

- If your mobile phone number is on file or if you have registered your student using the online centralized registration, you may log in to the Parent Portal using this mobile phone number.
- Your password is either your student's 6 digit student ID or the password you created when registering your student on the online centralized registration system.

## To Login Using Your 10-digit Parent Portal User ID

- Collier County Public Schools provides each parent/guardian, with custody of a child in the District, with an individual 10 digit Parent Portal login number for each child.
- You may log in to the Parent Portal using the 10 digit number as your Username.
- Your Password for the Parent Portal is your student's 6 digit Student ID.
- If you do not know your 10 digit Parent Portal number, you may obtain this information by visiting your child's school and retrieving your Parent Portal login information at the main office.


## **Face Coverings**

#### 1. Start Talking

Your child might have worries about returning to school. You can explore these and help them think of ways to manage their worries.

### 2. Sleep Routine

Help your child return to their normal sleep routine in the weeks before school starts again.

#### 3. Talk About School

Start to talk through the daily routine that they were once so familiar with. It doesn't have to start as a conversation about worries, but these might arise as you talk.



### 4. Coping Strategies

Model coping strategies you use when feeling stressed such as reconnecting with friends before returning, doing regular exercise, or using breathing techniques. If it applies, you could share your worries and feelings about returning to work and the ways you are managing these feelings.

#### 5. Make Yourself Available As Much As Possible

Children may want to come and "debrief" but maybe not when you expect. Create space for talking in different ways, such as going on a walk together or baking together – there may be less pressure in these circumstances than when sitting face-to-face.

#### 6. Look at the Positives

As schools reopen, other things will too. It might be helpful to talk about things the child is looking forward to, like their favorite shop reopening, seeing friends in the park or getting ice cream from their favorite café.
