Dress Code

The district's uniform dress policy promotes an environment that enhances learning and safety, encourages students to express individuality through personality and achievements, and creates a sense of school pride and belonging.

→ Pants/Bottom Attire

- 1. Must be khaki (tan), grey, white, navy blue or black slacks, shorts, skirts, skorts or jumpers, or plain blue or black denim jeans, shorts, skirts, skorts, or jumpers. A small trademark logo is acceptable.
- 2. Bottom attire must be plain without any holes, tears, tatters, or unfinished hems, and must be worn securely at the waist.
- 3. If bottom attire has visible belt loops, a belt must be used. Students in grades K-3 are exempt.

→ Shirts

- 1. Shirts must be standard short or long sleeve polo style, oxford style, or button-up dress shirt with a collar. A small trademark logo is acceptable.
- 2. K-8 schools may use any of the district approved colors and choose up to two additional standard school colors. Shirts must be solid color and fabric. No lace or sheer materials, including "cut outs".
- 3. 9-12 schools may use any solid color, striped or plaid collared button down or polo shirt. No lace or sheer fabric materials, including "cut outs".
- 4. On designated school Spirit Days or special events, students may wear their school logo t-shirt, team jersey, or club shirt. Items must represent the school the student attends. Friday of each week will be a designated Spirit Day for grades K-8. Grade 9-12 students may wear school logo shirts, team jerseys, or club shirts each day. Special school event days (such as Homecoming week, Cancer Awareness Day, Red Ribbon Week, etc.) will be designated by the school; dates will be released in advance.
- 5. It is recommended that shirts be tucked in. Cleavage must be covered.

→ Outer or cool weather attire must be school appropriate.

- 1. Zip- or button-up or "over the head" sweatshirts or sweaters are acceptable as long as required dress attire is worn beneath.
- 2. Items must be solid color.
- 3. Standard, required dress code must be worn, even when wearing cool weather attire.

Electronic Devices

All electronic devices including but not limited to iPods, MP3 players, and handheld games are not permitted in school or on campus. Please leave these items at home. The school assumes no responsibility if items are lost or stolen. Cell phones are not forbidden at school; however, their use is prohibited during the school day. Cell phones are to be off and put away, and not visible during school hours. The school assumes no responsibility for lost or stolen cell phones. Cell phones and all additional electronic devices will be confiscated from students who violate this policy.

Student Items

One of our primary goals is to provide our scholars with a safe learning environment that is also free from distractions to the learning process. In order to help us reach this goal, we need your assistance in monitoring what your child brings to school.

- <u>Medication</u>- If it is necessary for your scholar to take any form of medication at school, then the parent/guardian must bring the medicine in its original container, fill out the required form(s), and leave it with the school nurse. Your child should never be in possession of any over-the-counter or prescription medication. Students may carry inhalers that are prescribed for them with the proper forms submitted to the school.
- <u>Miscellaneous Items</u>- Please do not send cakes, cupcakes, or any other food items to school with your child. Indian Trails guidelines prohibit the sharing of food items. Balloons and other large items cause distractions in the classroom and are not permitted on the buses. Any food or additional items that cause distractions will be held in Student Services until a parent/guardian can pick them up.

School Advisory Council Meeting (SAC)



What is School Advisory Council (SAC)? SAC is a team of people representing various segments of the community-parents, teachers, students, administrators, support staff, business/ industry professionals, and other interested community members. The purpose of a SAC is to assist in the preparation and evaluation (developing and evaluating) of the results of the school improvement plan. Additionally, SAC receives funds to be used at the discretion of the School Advisory Committee, and a portion of this money should be used for implementing the school improvement plan. Attendance Policy

Not only does Florida law require student attendance each day, but also regular attendance is an important component in students' academic success. Research shows that school attendance and student achievement is directly correlated. State law and district attendance policy allows the parent to write notes to document and excuse up to 10 days of student absence for illness or excusable reasons per year: Five days in the first term (August through January) and 5 days in the second term (January through June). Beyond those 10 days, if a student has a serious reason to miss additional days, the school principal can review parent requests to excuse up to 5 more days per year, for a total of 15 days. Note: Students may not receive credit for work made up from unexcused absences which can impact grades. Beyond 15 days per year, only doctor/therapist or court notes are accepted to excuse absences. It is very important to document all days of absence with a note which must be turned in at school--even if the reason for the absence does not allow the day to be excused. It is important to note that family vacations are not excusable days. ITMS does not have a sick line to call in absences; please provide an absence note to the attendance office for events out of school. Questions about attendance should be directed to the attendance clerk, Mrs. Grant. Attendance is a big part of school success!

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Student Arrival and Departure

Per Flagler County Schools statute, Flagler County Public Schools employees are not responsible for supervising students arriving on campus more than 30 minutes before school sponsored activities begin and remaining more than 30 minutes after the end of school sponsored activities. Unless students are on campus early for a club or at a teacher's request, no student should be on campus before 7:10 a.m. Similarly, students should not remain on campus beyond 1:40 p.m. unless they are participating in a club, athletic team, or tutoring/study program. All after school programs run Monday through Thursday and conclude at 3:30 p.m. Please contact Indian Trails with specific questions.

Transportation

ITMS students get to and from school in a variety of ways. For the safety of all of our scholars, it is important for you and your child to follow the guidelines below.

- Bike riders Florida law requires students riding bicycles or skateboards to wear helmets. It is also important that students remain on the sidewalks and use the Flagler County crosswalks with crossing guards where applicable. Bicycles and skateboards must be locked up in the bike and skateboard rack located south of the school's main entrance. Both bicycles and skateboards are not to be ridden on the campus or walkways at any time. Neither FCPS nor ITMS is responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen bicycles or skateboards.
- Bus riders Students must follow the bus driver's directions at all times. While riding the bus, students are subject to the same disciplinary procedures as they are while in schools. Upon arrival and dismissal, students should always use the school's sidewalks to exit from and go to their buses. Also, remember that students must ride their assigned bus to and from school and may not board or depart the bus at a different stop. Furthermore, students may only ride their assigned bus.

This will provide you with the bus pick up location, pick up time, and bus name.

- Car riders All students should be delivered and picked up in the ITMS car rider loop located through the ITMS north gate entrance of the school. Cars should not drop students off on Belle Terre Parkway, in the front of ITMS (main entrance). Once in the car line, please follow the lines of traffic as directed by school personnel. In addition, we ask that you abide by the request to make right turns only onto Belle Terre during morning drop off. Please keep in mind that students are not permitted to walk through the parking lot to meet you. Finally, please watch out for our bike riders and walkers as you enter and leave our campus.
- Walkers Students who walk to and from school should stay
 on the designated sidewalks and refrain from walking in the
 street. Please be careful crossing the streets and please use the
 provided crosswalks and crossing guards where applicable.
- Activity pick up After school activities may conclude between 2:30 pm and 4 pm. Students will be picked up in the south bus loop off of the Bird of Paradise traffic light.
