Band News

MPA stands for "Music Performance Assessment". In the months of February and early March, our 8th graders (and some 7th graders) attended two MPA events. The judges at these events are experienced professional musicians that grade the students' performance. Using a music rubric, the judge's grade and then afterwards average the scores for an overall rating. The ratings include: "Superior" = A, "Excellent" = B, "Good" = C, "Fair" = D, and "Poor" = F. Students are judged on fundamentals, technical accuracy, and musicality.

- We had 30 students participate in Jazz MPA and the Jazz Band earned straight "Superior" or "A" ratings from all three judges.
- We had 65 students participate in Concert Band MPA and the Advanced Band earned straight "Superior" or "A" ratings from all three stage judges as well as the sight-reading judge.
- Congratulations to our AMAZING student musicians for another great year at MPA's!

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Testing Information

Testing Update:

Hello families! State testing season is fast approaching and it is vital that students are in attendance for testing dates. Please make sure students are well rested and eat breakfast at home or school on these dates:

- Writing (all students)- April 2nd
- FAST ELA (all students)- May 1st
- FAST Math, B.E.S.T Algebra EOC, and Geometry EOC (all students dependent of math class)- May 7th
- NGSSS Civics (7th grade) and Science (8th grade)- May 14th
- NGSSS Civics (8th graders enrolled in Civics)- May 15th

Additionally, here are some important testing rules to review with your child:

- Electronic Devices—Students are not permitted to have any
 electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones,
 smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing
 or during breaks (e.g., restroom), even if the devices are
 turned off or students do not use them. If your student is
 found with an electronic device or is found using Bluetooth/
 wireless headphones/earbuds during testing, his or her test
 will be invalidated.
- Testing Rules Acknowledgment—All tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking a checkbox beside the statement in the secure browser indicating they understand the testing rules.
- Discussing Test Content after Testing—The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they click the box to accept the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states that because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, students may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including the passages, prompts, and writing responses) after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites. Please make sure your student understands this policy prior

to testing and remind them that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.

- Working Independently—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated. In addition, the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) employs Caveon Test Security to analyze student test results to detect unusually similar answer patterns. Student tests within a school that are found to have extremely similar answer patterns will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus—If your student leaves campus before completing a test session (e.g., for lunch, an appointment), he or she will not be allowed to return to that test session. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please remember not to schedule appointments on testing days.
- Testing Accommodations—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a Section 504 Plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL) or a recently exited ELL, please contact the school to discuss the testing accommodations that will be provided for your student.

<u>In addition to state testing, below are the dates for semester</u> 2 exams.

Exams for all students by period- May 20th-23rd (20th-periods 7/6, 21st periods 5/4, 22nd periods 3/2, 23rd period 1)

If students miss an exam and do not make it up, the grade will be entered as a 0. Please contact your child's teacher if you have additional questions.

We look forward to a great testing season and rest of the school year!
