You can also include photos or video with your tip report.

## QUICKLY SEND TO AUTHORITIES

FortifyFL automatically routes your tip report to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.



#### Your School Officials

The tip report goes to your local school officials when submitted.

#### Local Law Enforcement

Your local police department or sheriff office receive copies of your tips automatically.

#### State - Level Officials

State-level officials also have access to your tips to make sure proper steps are taken.

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act.



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## **Reporting Suspicious** Activities or Threats

Students, parents, CCPS employees, and members of the community have a responsibility to report suspicious activities and potential threats to schools. Any suspicious activity or threat shall be promptly reported to one of the following individuals, agencies or reporting tools:

- School Resource Officer or local law enforcement agencies.
- School Administrator or any available staff member.
- The FortifyFL Reporting APP or to the Crimestoppers Tipline (1-800-780-TIPS).
- Contacting the Supervisor of District Security and Emergency Management at (941) 255-0808
- Calling 9-1-1.

## Beginning Band Update

Beginners met in August after school for "Basic Training" to receive their instruments and qo over fundamentals with professionals. Durina the first school quarter, students fine-tuned their skills and learned to assemble, hold, produce a tone, play five notes, articulate, and connect notes so they can perform melodies like the infamous "Hot Cross Buns!" For the second quarter, beginners have been honing their skills and learning to read music in preparation for their first performance at the Winter Concert in December!

This year we have 12 flutes, 30 clarinets, 20 trumpets, 17 trombones, 9 euphoniums, and 11 percussionists. Some of these students will be transferring to similar "pathway instruments" like french horn and tuba in January and later double reeds and saxophone in August!
