admission, and financial aid and scholarship resources. Please visit them and take advantage of this opportunity!

If your student is currently a senior, please continue checking their academic progress frequently and encourage consistent attendance, the completion of assignments, and effective test preparation strategies. If you have concerns, please reach out to their teachers immediately. The May 26 graduation ceremony is fast approaching, and no one wants your student left out of the celebration.

Bright Futures and Community Service information can be found on the LBHS website under the Student Services tab. Students may also visit the Building 5 Counseling Suite (05-013) for information and forms.

If your student's performance was less than successful during the first semester, it does not mean that second semester cannot yield positive outcomes. Communicate with teachers if there are concerns. Students may retake first semester classes via virtual school as they continue with second semester of the course in school. Only semester grades of D and F may be retaken for grade forgiveness. Summer School applications and information traditionally arrive in schools in late February. Contact your student's assigned counselor with any grade forgiveness, virtual school, or summer school questions.



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SRO

From the Lake Brantley School Resource Officers / Altamonte Springs Police Department

Attention Lake Brantley students and parents. Starting the month of January, the Lake Brantley School Resource Officers (SRO) will begin issuing tobacco/nicotine/vaping citations. The citations fall under Florida State Statute. The SRO team will be working together with administrators, teachers and security to maintain the safety of the campus and enforce school board policy regarding this matter. The different penalties a student may receive if issued a citation are as follows:

- Pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$25.00 plus a \$5.00 fee, by mail or in person to the Clerk of Court or
- Complete a school-approved anti-tobacco "alternative to suspension" program or anti-vaping "alternative suspension program", if available or
- Complete 50 hours of community service

Keep in mind the above information is from the Law Enforcement side. School discipline can also be issued by administrators due to the violation of school board policy.

This information is meant to serve as a heads up on what's coming and give you the opportunity to speak with your children about the hazards and penalties associated with tobacco/nicotine/vaping. SRO Anthony Gentile and Principal Brian Blasewitz have also gone on the schools morning announcements to relay the same message.

If you have any further questions about this topic, please contact the school and ask for one of our three School Resource Officers.

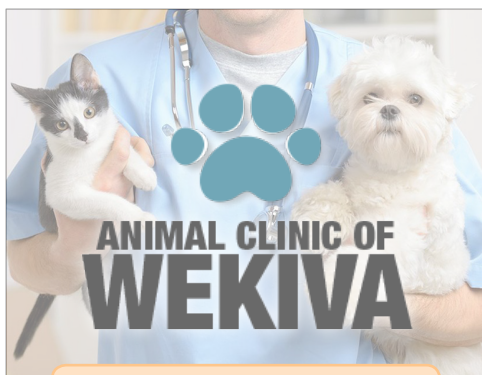
