

News -

Counselors have been very busy this first nine weeks getting to know their students as well as continuing to enroll new ones almost daily. Senior credit checks will be conducted the first week in September to discuss graduation requirements and post high school plans.

Student Services will be utilizing Skyward, cCampus, and Instagram to send out notifications and information. Follow us on Instagram: @LHHS_StudentServices. All students are enrolled in the Student Services cCampus course. Visit the course for valuable information from community service documents to virtual college visits.

The PSAT will be given on October 13th. The PSAT is administered each year, and its results are used for graduation requirements, scholarship opportunities, and student course placement. All 9th, 10th, and 11th graders will test. This is the only chance for juniors to compete in the National Merit Scholarship Competition. 12th graders will take the SAT this day.

Seniors -

Seniors should be completing college applications and sending transcripts if they have not already done so. To send a transcript, complete a request here https://tinyurl.com/LHHSTranscriptRequest. Please keep in mind that though you may request an electronic copy to be sent that day, the county only sends these records Tuesdays & Thursdays. Hard-copies of transcripts will be sealed in an envelope for the student to pick-up and mail themselves. Be sure to apply early (at least one school by Thanksgiving!). Florida colleges fill up quickly as supply is less than the demand. Pay attention to each college's application deadline as they don't all have the same one.

Tips for Seniors & Parents from College Financial Services

- Find out about grants & scholarships that are available in your state; make sure you understand the requirements (www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org)
- Find out if the schools of your choice have their own financial aid applications that need to be filled out. Be sure to request one now if you have not done so.
- Don't assume you won't qualify for need-based financial assistance.
 Apply even if you think you won't qualify. Students who receive financial assistance come from a wide variety of family income levels since many factors affect eligibility.
- Make sure you know about all the deadlines. Deadlines vary from school to

- school and program to program, and are very rarely extended!
- Make copies or notes about all documents you send; record when and to whom you sent them.
- The FAFSA for 2022-2023 can be submitted any time after October 1, 2021. Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov, the official website for the free financial aid form. Seminole County Public Schools will be offering FAFSA application support this fall. Please keep an eye out for announcements.

Scholarship Information- Scholarship information is beginning to arrive. As this is received, the information is placed on the announcements, as well as being posted in classrooms, and listed on the website (www.lakehowell.scps.k12.fl.us/Student-Services). Seniors should be checking weekly for this information. Computers with internet access are available for students to use in the Media Center and in the Student Services area for scholarship searches.

Florida State Grants & Scholarships Application (this includes Bright Futures.) Any student who applies for the Bright Futures Scholarship MUST complete an online application at http://www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/SSFAD/bf/. Once the application is completed, each student will receive a PIN number for future access. It is important that you don't lose this information as you will need to access your scholarship for the next four years with this login and pin. Senior parents, please make sure your student completes the online application. We encourage all seniors to apply once the application opens as it also evaluates them for other state grants and scholarships they may be eligible for. This application process should open for this year's seniors October 1, 2021.

Test Dates -

Registration information and practice booklets are available in the guidance lobby. You can also register and access practice materials online at: www.collegeboard.org and https://www.khanacademy.org/test-prep/sat for the SAT and at www.actstudent.org for the ACT. Please note the registration deadlines are usually one month before each test date.



Culinary

Welcome Back Silver Hawks! The Culinary program is so happy to start the new year...and get to welcome students in our classes (especially those who may have not been able to be on campus since March of 2020). We are also happy to have three full-time teachers back on campus: Ms. Glass, Mrs. Lacerenza, and Ms. Negron. We are excited to get to know our students and teach them some delicious recipes in the kitchen!

The beginning of the year is always a hectic start here in Culinary. The underclassmen are busy learning about food safety, and the seniors are helping to open the main lab and learn our faculty menu. If your student is in one of the Culinary classes, here are some events and activities we are looking forward to this semester:

- Industry Certification Testing: We offer free industry certification testing during the third course year here at LHHS (it is listed as Culinary 2 in Skyward). Students start working on that certification the first week in August and should be able to begin testing in mid to late October. The food safety certifications are both manager-level and serve as part of students' entry to our senior honors course. Both certifications are valid for 5 years. We also try to help students who may be looking for employment within the industry. Our business community partners know those students with single or dual certifications are knowledgeable and are highly valued potential employees.
- Culinary Goes Worldwide: This year, we are launching a web page just for Lake Howell Culinary. It is a central location where faculty and staff can find our lunch order forms, request account balance, and make payments on their house accounts. In addition, it is another location where we can post current pictures of what students are creating in class, that you otherwise might not get to see.
- Catering events: Many clubs and groups have inquired about having Culinary cater some of their events, and we are happy to help make that happen. If you are involved, contact us and we would be happy to give a quote and schedule your event, or have orders for foods, cookies or cakes ready to pick up.
- Social Media: Last year, Culinary really started to focus on utilizing social media. We began posting regularly on our social media platforms to help get students involved, show off some of the amazing food our students create, as well as learn new skills in the classroom and the kitchen. 














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NJRTOC

Lake Howell High School NJROTC Battalion

The acronym "NJROTC" stands for Naval Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps. The most frequently asked question is if it is required to join the military after graduating from school? The answer is NO. JROTC is not a recruiting tool. Instead, NJROTC is best described as a helping hand. The program aids cadets in developing a sense of discipline, character, and the ability to follow as well as to lead! This program teaches young people countless new things which unlocks talents many individuals never knew they had. The advantages Cadets gain from NJROTC are tremendous. Cadets gain necessary life skills which prepares them for the future.

This program consists of a combination of academics and physical fitness. It is inclusive of several different areas from the U. S. Navy which includes leadership, followership, oceanography, and naval history. Cadets participate in teams such as color guard, aviation, marksmanship, academics and unarmed/armed drill.

Here's a brief description of the three pillars of Silverhawk Battalion:

Color Guard

Ceremonial Flags are a significant part of the NJROTC program. Cadets carry ceremonial rifles, and the Navy service flag in tradition while protecting the National flag. Before all major events,

The Color Guard presents the National flag in unison with the playing of the National Anthem. This tradition is

rich in history and national pride. In addition, the Color Guard participates in all major JROTC competitions. Silverhawk Battalion is recognized as having one of the best Color Guards in Florida's Area 7.

Aviation

Lake Howell High School is partnered with Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. As such, under the JROTC umbrella, various aviation courses are offered. Cadets have the opportunity for dual enrollment in classes including aerospace technologies, principles of aerospace, and unmanned technology. Upon completion of these courses, Cadets will earn industry certification through the Unmanned Safety Institute, and they'll have the opportunity to attain the FAA Part 107 certificate.

Marksmanship

This can be described as a sport skill where an air rifle is aimed, controlled, and fired to consistently hit a target as well as a sport that has a huge military heritage. Cadets learn gun safety and basic marksmanship in range firing activities inclusive of competition firing in a series of positions. There are exceptional qualities of this sport, one being it's open to all Cadets. It is an exciting and uniquely challenging sport that teaches safety through rules and responsibility as well as concentration, goal setting and teamwork.

ROTC presents a variety of activities aimed at revealing a cadet's better version of themselves.


