A Message from the Principal

Dear Ram Families,

learning option you have chosen for your children. I must admit that this is the most

challenging Welcome Back letter I have written, because every family is in a unique situation, and students are being scheduled into a wide variety of classes, including face-to-face, Seminole Connect, SSC Dual Enrollment, and Seminole County Virtual School. Even so, there are several factors that are consistent for all LMHS students, and these are the factors that I will highlight in this letter.

- Safety Protocols: Students who report to campus for face-to-face classes will be required to follow safety protocols. Face coverings must be worn upon arrival and departure from campus, between classes, during lunch (except when students are seated and eating), and upon entering and exiting all classes. Further, face coverings must be worn in classes where students cannot be appropriately distanced by at least six feet.
- Student Support: Accommodations that are outlined through an IEP 504 Plan, and/or ESOL services will be provided to students by LMHS personnel no matter what learning option they choose.
- Extra-Curricular Activities: All students, no matter what learning option they choose, will have the opportunity to participate in extra-curricular activities.
- Student Wellness: Parents/guardians are asked to assess their child's wellness on a daily basis and to keep their child home from school if he or she is exhibiting any symptoms of COVID.
- **COVID Procedures:** LMHS will staff a COVID clinic for any students exhibiting COVID symptoms during the school day. The parents or guardians of students who enter this clinic will be called immediately to pick up their children.
- Athletic Participation: Tryouts and/or practices for fall sports will begin on August 31st. Fall sports teams may continue team workouts up until that date. All students participating in athletic workouts and/or troouts must have a physical on file with our athletic department.
- Transportation: School buses will continue to transport students to campus at the start of the school day and from campus at the end of the school day. Further, students will be expected to follow safety protocols while riding school buses. Families who choose a hybrid schedule will be responsible for transporting students who enter or leave campus at times other than the beginning or conclusion of the school day.
- Assessments: At this point, high stakes testing such as FSA, EOC, SAT, and ACT testing will continue to take place on the campus of Lake Mary High School.
- Mental Health Support: We recognize that many or our students may need mental health support from school staff. We will have a mental health counselor available four days a week to address the needs of individual students, as well as a counselor provided through New Horizons who will focus on students with personal or family addiction issues. Support from these counselors will also be provided to students learning from home. Further, we will staff a Social Worker who will connect families with resources in times of need. Finally, families should anticipate that all students will engage in lessons for social-emotional health throughout the school year.

During these uncertain times, I ask that all families remain patient, flexible, and committed to working with the staff at Lake Mary High School to ensure that all members of our Ram Family stay safe and all students make progress towards meeting their educational goals. Communication will be paramount to our success in offering a quality educational experience to students, no matter what format they utilize to access instruction.

***If you have purchased a parking decal within the online sale dates window, your decal is already


secured provided that you submit all of the required documentation and you do not have any debts owed to Lake Mary High School. ***

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Protocols

Face Coverings

COVID-19 spreads mainly from person to person through respiratory droplets produced when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby or possibly be inhaled into the lungs. Studies and evidence on infection control report that these droplets usually travel around 6 feet (about two arms lengths). Face coverings may slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others. Face coverings, as used in this plan, mean a uniform piece of material that securely covers a person's nose and mouth and remains affixed in place without the use of one's hands, whether store bought or homemade, concurrent with Seminole County Health Department guidelines.

Students are required to wear face coverings when they are not able to be 6 feet from others, are in hallway transitions/class changes, in large common areas, are riding SCPS bus transportation, and are in line in the dining room area. Face coverings may be removed for high intensity outdoor activities and when seated at the dining tables for eating. Accommodations for face covering protocols will be made for students/staff based on their individual health needs. A face covering shall not be required for the following individuals: (a) persons under the age of 2 years; (b) persons for whom a face covering would cause impairment due to an existing health condition or disability and a determination is made that an accommodation is not reasonably available; (c) persons engaging in high intensity physical exertion (e.g. exercising during PE, recess, etc.); (d) persons eating or drinking; (e) public safety, fire, and other life safety and health personnel who are on SCPS' campuses, as their personal protective equipment requirements will be governed by their respective agencies; and (f) persons communicating with someone who is hearing-impaired and must see the mouth of someone wearing a face covering in order to communicate and a determination is made that an accommodation is not reasonably available.

All SCPS staff members and adults visiting SCPS buildings will be required to wear face coverings in alignment with current state and local guidance, including, when they are unable to be 6 feet away from others.



Safeguards for Classrooms

- After-hours High Touch Surface disinfection with handheld, hospital grade misting machine for High Touch Surface disinfection conducted by school custodial staff.
- Routine cleaning and disinfection of school facilities will be scheduled (e.g., tables, desks, chairs, door handles, light switches, railinwgs, faucet/toilet handles, drinking fountains, playground equipment, gym equipment, cafeteria tables/carts/trays, countertops) throughout the school day In accordance with the SCPS Custodial Handbook.
- Placement of physical barriers such as plexiglass at reception desks in front lobbies, guidance, and discipline offices, and in other high traffic/contact areas as noted by building administrators.
- Social distancing floor/seating markings installed in waiting and reception areas. Signage displayed in restrooms and locker rooms to remind for proper social distancing, to include frequent reminders to staff and students to stay at least 6 feet apart where possible.
- Directional reminders will be posted on the floor and/or walls to manage traffic flow during transitions.
- Furniture removed in common areas to avoid crowding.
- Arrival/dismissal will be monitored to discourage congregating and ensure that students go straight from vehicle/buses to classrooms or designated waiting areas. Students who drive to school and arrive early are asked to wait in their cars until it's time for the bell to ring.
- Non-essential visitors and activities involving external groups or organizations will be limited.
- There are some support services for education and mental health that will require students to leave or join

other cohort groups during the school day. These student groupings will be tracked, and attendance will be kept.

- The number of student transitions during the school day will be minimized. Desks or seating will be arranged so that students are as physically distanced as possible.
- Sharing of personal items and supplies will be limited.
- Classroom materials will be limited to small groups and disinfected between uses.
- The use of soft/plush items will be minimized, and area rugs, and other personal items will be removed from classroom.
- Use of water fountains that are not fill stations will be limited: students and staff will be strongly encouraged to bring water from home or use individual disposable water bottles.
- Students will have access to soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, cleaning and disinfection supplies for staff, paper towels, and tissue. Hand washing with soap for 20 seconds will be reinforced and/or hand sanitizer use.
- Staff and students will be encouraged to cough and sneeze in elbows, or to cover with a tissue. Used tissues must be thrown in the trash and hands must be washed immediately.

Protocols

Screening for Illness

SCPS will employ a combination of selfscreening and observational screening protocols for universal screening of illness of staff and students. We will continue to communicate information to parents and employees about the symptoms of COVID-19 and require them to selfscreen before coming to school. Students and employees exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 without being otherwise explained, are prohibited from coming to school, and if they do come to school, they should be sent home immediately. According to current Florida Department of Health guidance, symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. Employees and students will be trained to recognize the following COVID-19-related symptoms:

- Fever (100 degrees or greater) or chills
- Couah
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

(This list does not include all possible symptoms. Seminole County Health Department will continue to update the list as they learn more about COVID-19.)

In addition, the district/school may take the temperature of students and employees on a random basis or in situations where there is reason to believe that the person may be ill. Touch-free thermometers will be utilized and will be provided for use in clinics, at front desks, to dining service staff, and any other school/ district area where a team has determined a specific need.

There will be a separate room/clinic for any students to be assessed who may be exhibiting COVID 19 symptoms. Parents of students exhibiting symptoms will be called immediately to pick up their child from school.

Isolation from School and Protocols to Return to School After Home Isolation

Students and employees should be isolated from school if they test positive for COVID-19. Determinations about the need for home isolation and the length of the isolation period will be made in collaboration with families, the schoolbased administrator, the health services team, and the Seminole County Health Department. Once a student or employee is isolated from the school environment, he/she may return if he/she satisfies the recommendations of the Seminole County Health Department. The district and the Seminole County Health Department will continue to collaborate to refine and implement COVID-19 protocols to assess risk and respond to school-specific matters based on all relevant factors and current information.

Counseling Support through New Horizons

The New Horizons Program is continuing to serve students through telehealth! We are continuing telehealth support and counseling services through Zoom Pro which is HIPAA compliant for privacy.

The New Horizons Program serves students having issues such as poor coping skills, anger management and anxiety.

Students who are interested in joining New Horizons for group or individual support counseling can have their parents reach out to Laura Wheeler, the New Horizons counselor at Lake Mary High School. Laura can be reached at 407-603-6056 or through email at Laura.Wheeler@aspirehp.org. She is available to meet with students Monday through Friday. Individual, group and family sessions are available.

The Student Services department at Lake Mary High school is eager to connect with our students. We strive to ensure all students develop self-advocacy skills; therefore, we encourage our students to visit our LMHS webpage, go to the student services tab in order to be able to book an appointment with their counselor. In the beginning of the year, counselors will be working hard to enroll new students, adjust schedules, and conduct senior credit checks. While this is a busy time for counselors, please know that your child is a priority, and our counselors are here to help!

Schedule Changes

Student Services

In order to efficiently serve all our students Lake Mary High School, once schedules are available in Skyward the week before school starts, we will ONLY make schedule changes for the following reasons:

- If your child is a Senior in need of a specific class required for graduation.
- If the student has already earned credit for the class.
- If the student has been placed in the wrong level class.

If any of the above criteria applies to your child schedule change requests can be submitted during the first week of school.

Steps for Fall 2020 Dual Enrollment Applicants <u>New Process Due to COVID-19 Pandemic</u>

Students should consult with school counselor regarding criteria for enrollment.

*Students that are returning Dual Enrollment students will begin at step 2.

1. Students seeking to start Dual Enrollment with Seminole State FALL 2020 or later must complete the Dual Enrollment Application (leave the counselor consent section blank) and email it to dualenrollment@seminolestate.edu. The deadline for new fall applications was July 31, 2020.

- 3. Student then emails LMHS counselor with their specific courses of interest to determine eligibility. At this time test scores are not required. However, alternate placement methods are being used to determine eligibility.
- 4. Registration for the Fall opened on July 1, 2020. <u>After this date</u> student must complete the <u>SSC Dual Enrollment Registration Form</u> (http://www.lakemaryhs.scps.k12.fl.us/ Portals/176/assets/doc/2019-2020/Dual Enrollment/EnrollmentServicesandRegistrar_ RegistrationForm_Fillable_NoE-Signatures_1019.pdf?ver=2020-04-27-111002-617) and email it to dualenrollment@seminolestate.edu Copy your LMHS counselor on this email.
- 5. Once student is enrolled in classes he/she will receive a copy of their schedule in their SSC email account. Send your LMHS counselor copy of your SSC dual enrollment schedule. is important that your LMHS counselor knows exactly what you have registered for so that she can be sure that your LMHS schedule reflects DE and is correct.
- Once students return to LMHS in August each Dual Enrollment student will need to have an <u>868 Book Form</u> (https://dualenroll.scps.k12. fl.us/Registration) completed and signed by the principal/counselor to obtain books from SSC for their Dual Enrollment course(s).
- 7. SSC fall classes begin August 24, 2020.

Testing

PSAT: The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT NMSQT) will be given at Lake Mary High School on Wednesday, October 14th to all 9th, 10th and 11th grade students. For juniors, the PSAT is the only avenue to the National Merit Scholarship Program. All students will take the PSAT free of charge and do not need to register for this.

SAT: The SAT will be given at Lake Mary High School on Wednesday, October 14th to all 12th grade students. All students will take the SAT free of charge and do not need to register for this.

ACT/SAT: All colleges, universities, and community colleges require the SAT or ACT for admission or placement. Most colleges/universities will accept both the SAT or ACT. Lake Mary High School's code number is 100883. (Be sure to bubble the high school code on your registration form so that your scores are sent to us.)



Bully Prevention Awareness and Reporting

Bullying means systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on another person that includes: unwanted and repeated written, verbal, or physical behavior that is severe or pervasive enough to:

- create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment;
- cause discomfort or humiliation;
- unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation.

If your child feels as if he or she is being bullied, please direct him or her to do the following:

- 1. All student athletes entering the ninth grade must have been promoted from the 8th grade and maintain a 2.0 grade point average.
- 2. Each athlete must complete and pass a physical prior to trying out in any sport; this includes any pre-season conditioning practice. All physicals must be signed by a parent/guardian. Physical forms are available below, in the front office, guidance and the athletic office; however, the process is now electronic. Go to athleticclearance.com to submit the required documents.
- All student athletes are subject to and must adhere to the SCPS Citizenship Policy. Athletic participation is a privilege and all athletes must represent their school and sport in a positive light on and off campus or risk the chance of losing this privilege.

All requirements listed above must be met **prior** to tryouts/participation.

- Register and complete the 7 fields including a security question. Parents MUST register with a valid email username and password.
- 3. You will be asked to submit an activation code that will be displayed on the screen. Enter the code and click submit.
- 4. Login using your email address and password that you registered with.
- 5. Select "Start Clearance Here" to start the process.
- Select "School Year", select "School", Select "Sport" in which the student plans to participate in first. (you can select other sports later)

- 7. Complete all required fields for
 - a. Student Information-
 - b. Student Uploads-
 - If you have a current physical on file in the athletic office we can upload it. Remember a physical dated from your doctor lasts 365 days.
 - ii. If you have played a sport at Lake Mary we can verify your birth certificate. 9th
 - graders and transfers need to provide this upload.
 - iii. Please upload a picture of your insurance card. If you have school insurance we will verify coverage in the athletic office.
 - iv. Parent Driver's License- used to confirm parent consent.
 - c. Medical History- Answer all questions and provide necessary information.
 d. Signature Forms- Parents and Students sign each form.
 - d. Signature Forms- Parents and Student: Optional Donation to your athletic program.
 - Once you reach the Confirmation Message you have completed the process.
- Once you reach the **Commation Wessage** you have completed the process.
 If you would like to register for additional sports you may check off those sports below the
 - Confirmation Message. Electronic signatures will be applied to the additional sports/activities
- All of this data will be electronically filed with your school's athletic department for review. When the student has been cleared for participation, an email notification will be sent.
- <u>Note:</u> Participation in a program for conditioning, open facilities, tryouts, or practice can not occur until you have been notified by the athletic department of your clearance status.
