Dear Ram Families,

As the end of the third quarter approaches, it's crunch time for our students as they work to maximize their academic performance and prepare for End-of-Course assessments, Advanced Placement exams, and Industry Certification tests. We know this can be a stressful time for our students, so please stay informed about assessment dates (included in this newsletter), communicate with your children about their preparation plans, and monitor their personal well-being. If you have questions or concerns, please contact your child's school counselor or any member of our administrative team. We're here to help!

Senior Parents/Guardians: With graduation around the corner, there are many items on your child's To Do list before the big day. Primarily, make sure that you and your child have reviewed the Credit Check conducted by counselors in the fall and that your child is on track for meeting all graduation requirements. In addition, make certain that your child has no debt with our bookkeeping office and that graduation fees have been paid. If you have concerns about paying this fee, please contact Assistant Principal Melisa Ayala-Cruz. In this newsletter, you will find details about Senior Week activities and graduation. Finally, if your child will be attending college in the fall, please encourage him or her to visit the College/Career Room during their lunch period to learn about scholarships.

Course Registrations for 2020-21: Underclass students have been registering for the classes they want to take during the 2020-2021 school year. Our Curriculum Guide has been posted to the guidance tab of our web page for your reference. Our goal for all students is that they earn credit for at least one college course through either Advanced Placement classes, Dual Enrollment classes OR at least one industry certification through a Career/Technical program before they graduate. Please discuss course registration plans with your children to ensure they are making the best decisions to prepare for their futures, and if you would like to make any changes before the end of the school year, please contact your child's guidance counselor.

Student Support: We have programs in place to support our students both academically and emotionally. Tutoring sessions are staffed by our teachers in the Media Center every Tuesday and Thursday afternoon from 2:45 – 4:15 pm. All students are welcome to attend. We also have a mental health counselor and a social worker who meet with students to support mental wellness. If you believe your child needs assistance, please contact your child's counselor.

Student Attendance: Consistent school attendance is critical to student success. Please be aware that students who accrue 10 unexcused absences in any class will be denied credit for that class. Our attendance office will communicate with all students in this situation to offer them opportunity to recover credit by attending after school tutoring sessions. Please access Skyward regularly to keep track of your children's absences so that they avoid having their credits denied due to excessive absences.

Thank you for supporting Lake Mary High School and partnering with us to secure a quality educational experience for your child. We are privileged, each and every day, to serve you and your children.

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Credit Reinstatement Information

Students lose credit for class once they reach the 10th unexcused absence in a semester, regardless of a passing grade. We offer the opportunity for students to reinstate their credit by making up missed time due to absences. Students will receive instructions regarding credit reinstatement from the Attendance Office. Students must attend tutoring on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons in the media center, OR they can work with their teacher for the required number of hours in order to have their credits reinstated. Documentation of tutoring is required and must be signed by a teacher or counselor who provided the tutoring to the student.



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Feature Teacher: Mrs. Lucy Duffey

This year marks 23 years in the classroom for Mrs. Duffey, and she is one of the highly esteemed teachers in the legal studies program. Mrs. Duffey has an incredible background, and her experiences lend themselves to her instruction. "My first job was working as a social worker with AIDS patients. I set up a little night school to help nurses in the 1990's deal with needs of these new patients and improve their note taking skills. I found I loved it and went back to school to become a teacher. Life as you know often goes in unexpected directions, and I ended up working in the oldest African American School west of the Mississippi in St. Louis, Missouri. I went on to earn my Masters in Education from Webster. I became a teacher rather late in life- in my middle thirties."

In 2003, Mrs. Duffey was flown to London to appear on the BBC production of "America on Trial" defending our country's actions in the Middle East. In 2006, she was named one of the Top 10 best educators in Missouri. She was sent to study in China for three months at Peking University, and was awarded the Apple in Education by Met Life in 2009 named as one of the top 25 best Civics teachers in America. With the Teaching American History grant she was able to write lesson plans and present ideas for teaching history at National History Conferences. In 2011, she had lunch with Secretary of Education Arne Duncan and in 2014 was given the Street Law Teacher of the Country in Washington D.C. She is also proud of having started an organization called Give Back Teens in St. Louis, Missouri, which donated hundreds of books to inner city classrooms. She used to spend Sundays working at the Century Church homeless kitchen and instead of Saturday detentions at school-her students worked off detentions in the kitchen.

When she is not at Lake Mary, she is with her family or enjoys reading. She has three children and has been with her husband almost 30 years. She has three cats: Loki, Thor and T Rex and volunteers weekly at the Halifax Humane Society as a "cat socializer" and "dog calmer". She also take photos of the animals for their website. She is also passionate about Sepsis education after her youngest child almost passed away this summer (Sepsis.org).

Feature Program

The Program of Emphasis in Legal Studies is a progressive program at Lake Mary that allows students to develop analytical skills and gain experience, helping them prepare for careers as attorneys, judges, paralegals, law enforcement officers and more! Mrs. Duffey and Attorney Strickland teach the classes that align with the program. The students explore several legal subjects, including criminal law, contract law, family law, constitutional law and torts. Students may also choose to complete both the Forensics & Legal Studies track, allowing them to earn up to 12 college credits during their senior year, through dual enrollment at Seminole State College. Students in the program also have the opportunity to gain additional valuable experience and sharpen their legal skills by participating in *Mock Trial, Youth in Government, and We the People and Law Club.

Media Center Update

If your child is new to Lake Mary High, please have them stop by the Media Center and we will make them an official school ID. All students who may have lost their ID can have it replaced for \$5.00.

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How to Schedule an Appointment with Your Counselor

Students can schedule an appointment with their counselor by clicking on the student services page and selecting counselors and appointments.

Dual Enrollment

Students wishing to take a dual enrollment course must meet certain criteria. A general education dual enrollment course requires a 3.0 and a career dual enrollment course requires a 2.5 GPA. College ready placement courses are also required. Students can use their SAT or ACT scores or may take the PERT at Seminole State College for free. Students who plan to enroll can do so at dualenroll.scps.k12.fl.us/registration. Print it and take it to Student Services and then Dr. Reynolds for approval.

Community Service

At Seminole County Public Schools (SCPS), we encourage students to develop a sense of responsibility for others within their community. Beginning with the 2016-17 school year, Seminole County Public Schools has revised its process for students to identify, document, and submit volunteer service hours. This process has been designed to comply with recent changes to Florida law regarding the type of service eligible for the award of Bright Futures scholarships. Please note the following information:

1. Students can obtain a SCPS Volunteer Service Program Guidelines & Service Plan form from their high school. The new process gives students more flexibility with regards to the types of experiences and organizations where students can earn service hours. The student must identify a social or civic issue or a professional area that interests him or her and then complete hours related to this issue in a business or government internship, work for a nonprofit community service organization, activities on behalf of a candidate for public office, or similar work. All service must be unpaid, must not earn other academic credit, and meet other requirements explained on the volunteer service program form. All questions regarding the process should be directed to the student's school counselor.
2. Current students who were already documenting service hours prior to 2016-17 may continue to do so without moving to the new form and process.
3. Because there are more service options under the new procedure, there is no longer a centralized list of pre-approved service organizations. Students are strongly encouraged to get their service plan approved in advance to ensure that hours will be accepted and approved by the principal/designee. Organizations interested in student volunteers may send an email to ePathways@scps.us or contact school counselors directly at a high school of interest.

Summer School

If your child failed a course first semester, please begin planning for him or her to attend summer school. The applications are available in Student Services.

Also be aware that Drivers Education is available during summer. There is a separate application that can also be found in Student Services. Drivers Education will not be available at Lake Mary High School but will be available at other high schools. Students must have their learners permit to participate in Drivers Education.

Students who wish to take a summer school class for acceleration should do so either through Seminole County Virtual School or Dual Enrollment. In fact, Lake Mary High School offers a Dual Enrollment course on campus in Life and Career Planning. See

your counselor for details. Students need a 2.5 GPA to enroll.

Schedule change requests deadline: May 27th

Students use floridashines.org to search scholarships, determine Bright Futures eligibility, match your compatibility with universities and colleges, build a resume, and take career and interest surveys and for more scholarship information use the following Seminole County Public Schools website: <https://www.scps.k12.fl.us/district/departments/epathways/scholarships/>.

Registration

Counselors are conducting in person meetings with students by grade level to discuss next year's course selection and input requests as quickly as possible. Please note, there are no courses that will "fill" at this point in the registration process, which allows flexibility by eliminating prioritization of requests and provides more time to meet with students.

Bright Futures Scholarships

All Lake Mary High School seniors completed the online Bright Futures Scholarship application, Florida Financial Aid Form. Completion of the Florida Financial Aid Form assures that each senior's transcript will be evaluated for the Bright Futures Scholarship Program and other scholarships awarded by the state for which a student may qualify. After completing the FFAF, students will receive an email (to the email address the student entered on the FFAF) from the Florida Office of Student Financial Assistance.

Students received their username and PIN that will enable them to access their Bright Futures evaluation and contains a listing of the scholarships that the student is being evaluated for. Please note this is not the FAFSA, which students and parents need to complete to be eligible for any need based financial assistance. Transcripts will be sent to the Office of Student Financial Assistance in Tallahassee in February for the Bright Futures Scholarship initial 7th semester evaluation. Seniors' transcripts will be sent after graduation for a final evaluation for a Bright Futures Scholarship award. Seniors who need to complete their 100 hours for the Bright Futures Scholarship must have this completed



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and turned into the Guidance Office BEFORE graduation. Seniors who need to improve SAT or ACT test scores can take these tests in May or June.

ACT/SAT

All colleges, universities, and community colleges require the SAT or ACT for admission or placement. Most colleges/universities will accept both the SAT or ACT. We strongly recommend and encourage all college-bound Juniors to take the SAT and/or ACT before the end of your Junior year. Lake Mary High School's code number is 100883. (Be sure to bubble the high school code on your registration form so that your scores are sent to us.)

Testing

SAT: The SAT will be given at Lake Mary High School on Wednesday, March 4th to all 11th grade students. All students will take the SAT free of charge and do not need to register for this test.

ACT/SAT: All colleges, universities, and community colleges require the SAT or ACT for admission or placement. Most colleges/universities will accept both the SAT or ACT. Lake Mary High School's code number is 100883. (Be sure to bubble the high school code on your registration form so that your scores are sent to LMHS.)

- When prompted, students can agree to link their Khan Academy and College Board accounts
- Sign in to College Board account at www.collegeboard.org
- When prompted, students click "Send" to authorize the account linking
- Students can start practicing on Official SAT practice on Khan Academy

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Bully Prevention Awareness and Reporting

Bullying means systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on another person that includes: unwanted and repeated written, verbal, or physical behavior that is severe or pervasive enough to:

- create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment;
- cause discomfort or humiliation;
- unreasonably interfere with the individual's school performance or participation.

If your child feels as if he or she is being bullied, please direct him or her to do the following:

1. Report the situation:
 - a. To any adult on campus
 - b. Speak Out Hotline (1-800-423-8477)
 - c. Report through the P3 Campus App
2. Be sure to fill out a witness statement in the discipline office explaining the situation in detail.
3. The situation will be investigated by an administrator.
