As my first year at Lehigh Senior High ends, I have to say again that there is no other school where I would rather be. By the time families receive this newsletter, we will have graduated close to 540 Seniors and are currently gearing up to welcome approximately 700 Freshmen for the 24-25 school year. Our academia shined this year with having a Merit Scholar finalist, four Take Stock in Children Scholarships and two Golden Apple Recipients. Our athletics program has achieved state bids in cross country, track and unified sports along with seven athletic scholarship signings this school year. In Center of the Arts news, our Theatre department earned male actor of the year runner up at our High School Musical awards, a state contender in Choir, and a handful of superiors in Band, Dance and other assessments. During our Senior Academic Signing Day, we hosted over 50 Seniors who signed certificates of intent along with welcoming over 250 Seniors and

Our school participated in several district programs such as Sandy Hook, Lee Listens, Peer to Peer mentoring, AVID revalidation and High Reliability Schools Level One certification. This upcoming year our school will continue to ensure a safe, supportive and collaborative environment while working towards level 2 certification of demonstrating effective teaching in every classroom.

With some new in school safety initiatives, we have minimized our tardies and provided an Alternative to Success program. We have addressed dress code and electronic device issues. Lehigh Senior is working towards putting a cell phone hotel policy in place and prohibiting attire with hoodies attached for the 2024-2025 school year. These initiatives, along with ongoing Open Gate, security cameras, alarms, and security staff help aide in the continuation of our mission to increase achievement and improve teaching.

We have some exciting opportunities coming up for our teachers this summer as they participate in Professional Learning to hone their crafts as we enter the new school year. We also have an opportunity for incoming Freshmen to participate in our Lightning Launch to onboard 9th graders and allow them a sneak peek at the life of a Lehigh student. I look forward to seeing what the future holds for all our Lehigh Scholars, former, current and new. We'll see you out there.

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C3R Cyndi Chiorello 5K Color Run

On May 11, 2024, Lehigh Senior hosted the inaugural C3R Cyndi Chiorello 5K Color Run. Earlier this year in January 2024, a longtime leader for The School District of Lee County and a legacy at Lehigh Senior High School, Assistant Principal Cyndi Chiorello, was diagnosed with breast cancer. "Chiorello" has been in education and working for Lee County Schools since 1997 when she became a PE teacher. During that time, she was also the Varsity Girls Softball Coach where she worked closely with Lehigh's student athletes both on the field and in the classroom. With her desire to lead and make an impact with young athletes, she transitioned into the role of Athletic Director in 2004. She remained in that role until her heart pulled her to Administration. Cyndi became Lehigh Senior's Assistant Principal in 2014. Cyndi is foundational to the "family" that has been created at Lehigh Senior High School. This special event allowed us as a community to shower Cyndi, and her wife and children, with the financial support that will be needed over the next several months of chemotherapy, radiation treatment, and ultimately, surgery. This year, the Lehigh community raised over \$9,000! This will be an annual event and we hope you will join us in the fight against breast cancer in the Spring of 2025!



Hall Passes	Students will be taught how to use the Silent Pass app on our LaunchPad as it pertains to hall passes. Requesting a hall pass is the students' responsibility. Students will be given two hall passes per day and must carry our 'FATHEAD" pass when leaving. A student who leaves the classroom MUST: • Ask for teacher permission to leave the classroom. • Wait for escort to arrive • Complete Silent Pass on Launch Pad. The correct time the student left the classroom will appear on screen and begin a timer. • Cell phones and electronic devices will remain in the cell phone hotel while out of class during instructional time. A student who returns to the classroom MUST: • Log in to class upon return so the timer will stop, and the student can be marked as having returned. Must have a signed pass with the date and time if returning from the Clinic, Main Office, Media Center, or another teacher.
