





## SOCIAL STUDIES DEPARTMENT

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
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#### LELY HIGH SCHOOL PROJECT UNIFY

Team sports bring people together. Special Olympics Unified Sports teams do that, too and much more.

Inclusive Sports – provides opportunities for students with and without intellectual disabilities to participate in sports activities alongside one another and which we have found to be among the most conducive activity for breaking down stereotypes.

Lely High School is a National Banner Unified Champion Schools. LHS was named a Unified Champion School last year, after meeting three important requirements: having a unified sports program, hosting a unified club called Project Unify, and participating in the Special Olympics R Word campaign, "Spread the word to end the word," to end the hurtful and dehumanizing use of the word "retarded."

This year LHS Unified Sports participated in basketball, bowling and track.

The LHS Project Unify Basketball Team placed third in the Division 1 State Championship game on Saturday, March 6th. This is the third year in a row that the team has placed in this championship. As a bonus, our very own Jenninson Payen is a finalist of the Naples Daily News Special Olympics Athlete of the Year!

The LHS Project Unify All Girl Bowling Team made an unforgettable impact on the sport this year. Although, this was their first time participating in the sport, they bowled like seasoned professionals. On September 29, 2018 they took first place in the Division 2 Regional Games. It was an exciting event with great sportsmanship and friendship shown by all the participants.

LHS Project Unify added track to its list of Unified sports this year. After successfully competing in the 4x100 and 4x400 relay teams on April 17th, 2019 both the girls and the boys will advance to compete in the FHSAA Unified State Track Meet in Jacksonville, Florida at the University of North Florida. The track meet will take place on Saturday, May 4th, 2019.

Lely High School embraces unity, achievement and dignity. And our goal as a school is to continue that same feeling long after the competitions are over. We see a world where there is no 'us' or 'them.' Instead, peoples of all abilities are treated with dignity and respect and all are welcomed with acceptance and understanding.

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
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
