

I hope everyone enjoyed a great holiday. As we begin a new semester, it is important for all students to get off on the right foot academically. Attendance plays a large role in the academic success of a student and I thought I would share some attendance information with you.

THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE!

Showing up for school has a huge impact on a student's academic success. Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students get to school safely every day and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other potentially serious difficulty.

- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, regular and high attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10 percent, or about 18 days, of the school year can drastically affect a student's academic success.
- Students can be chronically absent even if they only miss a day or two every few weeks.
- Attendance is an important life skill that will help your child graduate from college and keep a job.

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

Make school attendance a priority.

- Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day, make that the expectation.
- Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.

- Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomach aches may be signs of anxiety.

Help your teen stay engaged.

- Find out if your child feels engaged by his classes and feels safe from bullies and other threats. Make sure he/she is not missing class because of behavioral issues and school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, please contact us.
- Stay on top of academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors if necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you. Email can be easy and convenient way to communicate with teachers.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage meaningful afterschool activities, including sports and clubs.

Communicate with the school.

- Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties
- Talk to teachers if you notice sudden changes in behavior. These could be tied to something going on at school.
- Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not piling up.
- Ask for help from school officials, afterschool programs, other parents or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your child to school.




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QUICKLY AND EASILY SUBMIT A TIP

FortifyFL automatically routes your tip report to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.



Your School Officials

The tip report goes to your local school officials when submitted.

Local Law Enforcement

Your local police department or sheriff office receive copies of your tips automatically.

State-Level Officials

State-level officials also have access to your tips to make sure proper steps are taken.

FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act.



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Physical Activity and Fitness

Fitness is a really important part of our body's health. It allows us to feel good and have as much energy as we possibly can. Benefits of fitness allows one to focus in school or at work. The more active and fit you are, the more calories you can burn; even when you are at rest! It helps you manage your weight, improve the health of your heart, lungs, bones, and joints. All the while lowering the risks of diseases you may get if you are unhealthy and overweight. If you already have one of these problems, getting more fit may help with the problems and make you feel better about yourself. Being fit also allows you to sleep better, handle stress, and keep your mind sharp.

There are three different kinds of physical activities that will help you improve your fitness: aerobic fitness, muscle fitness, and flexibility. Aerobic fitness is how well your body uses oxygen. Any activity that allows your heart to beat faster, such as running, will improve your heart, lungs, and muscles. Aerobic fitness is usually referred to as "cardio". Examples include jogging, cycling, and swimming. These types of activities will make your heart beat faster and help improve those organs and muscles. Muscle fitness means you are building your muscles and the amount of time you can use them for. For example, doing push-ups or weight training will help improve your muscle fitness. Last but not least is flexibility. This helps you move your joints and muscles through their full range of motion. Such things like yoga and daily stretching will help improve your flexibility.
