Principal's Message

Hello Parents/Guardians,

Recently there have been many reports in the news highlighting the fact that many students are earning failing grades not only in Florida but nationwide. The reasons for a student earning failing grades can range from not performing well in the online learning platform, absences from school due to health concerns or sickness to students struggling with their social emotional health during the pandemic. I wanted to take a minute to remind you of the services we provide at Lemon Bay High School that can be a resource if your find your child is struggling with earning passing grades.

Tutoring:

Lemon Bay High School, thanks to the funding by our Academic Booster Club, the Lemon Bay Community Academic Partners, is offering free tutoring services to all students Monday through Thursday from 2:30pm to 3:30pm each week in the Media Center. The tutoring is run by our teachers and staff and is supported by our Honor Society Students. Students struggling in class can attend any or all days. As well as staffing the tutoring sessions with teachers and students, this year we have added a school counselor to attend each tutoring day in case students have other questions related to classes, school or personal issues. As well as offering tutoring in the Media Center, numerous teachers offer before and after school help in their classrooms. If your child is falling behind in classwork/homework and struggling with grades, please contact the child's teachers or school counselor.

Social/Emotional Health:

Lemon Bay provides services to support student's social and emotional health. We employ a full-time social worker, Ms. Robinson, as well as three full time school counselors, Mrs. Bedford, Ms. Patterson and Mrs. Ragazzone. The school counseling offices are located in our three-story building on the third floor,

Student conflicts occur on any high school campus. Those conflicts typically result in a difference of opinions. Overcoming differences and embracing diversity is what we believe makes Lemon Bay High School a great school for our students. Our students strive to support each other and demonstrate kindness and compassion. Our school district and school take a strong stand to ensure bullying behaviors do not occur. Keep in the mind, the following "RIP" acronym if you are unsure if bullying is occurring and should be reported:

- **R** = Repeated (occurs more than once)
- I = Imbalance of Power (is the victim perceived as younger, weaker, less smart, or less socially accepted)
- **P** = Purposeful (it was deliberate or intended, not accidental)

What is Bullying? Bullying, which includes cyberbullying, occurs when a person or group of people repeatedly hurt, embarrass, or frighten another person. Cyberbullying means bullying through the use of technology or any electronic communication regardless of whether the bullying occurs on or off school grounds. Examples of cyberbullying include but are not limited to: text/instant messaging, e-mails, creation of a webpage impersonating another person and/ or other electronic means through the internet.

Bullying is not:

- An altercation between equals
- Good natured playful teasing among equals or peers
- An isolated incident

You can report a bully situation on our school's website using the "Report Bullying" button. You can also talk to an Assistant Principal about a situation you feel needs reported. Remember, we are here to help!

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

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AP Scholar Award Levels

AP Scholar

Granted to students who receive scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.

AP Scholar with Honor

Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

AP Scholar with Distinction

Granted to students who receive an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

State AP Scholar

Granted to the one male and one female student in each U.S. state and the District of Columbia with scores of 3 or higher on the greatest number of AP Exams, and then the highest average score (at least 3.5) on all AP Exams taken.

National AP Scholar

Granted to students in the United States who receive an average score of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.

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


Reporting Suspicious Activities Or Threats
