GIRLS SOCCER



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AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY TIMELINE

Students in Ms. Bayouth's Spanish I classes researched an important event in African American History and created flyers in which they used the 5 W's: who, what, where, when and why.

Beyond learning the question words in Spanish, using the 5 W's helped them organize their ideas as they completed their research. The project also helped them develop their historical analysis skills, by identifying the "before" and "after" for each event. Doing so helped them understand why these events are considered pivotal moments in African American History.

Shawnyai Mitchell and Isaiah Butler worked on the final layout of the timeline, organizing events in chronological order and designing the timeline itself. All groups were happy to see the final product of their collaborative effort!
