Dear Parents/Guardians,



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


WRESTLING

For the Trojan Wrestling, twice is nice. Ryder Luck is the second Lincoln wrestler to win a state championship, joining Tristan Sommer who won in 2013. The Trojan heavyweight won on a 3-2 decision. Luck is the first to win in the heavyweight

class, winning at 285 pounds in Class 2A. Ranked as the top wrestler in the state in his weight class heading into the tournament, Luck cemented his status as the best in Florida with his victory. Following the win, Luck ran around the mat and then celebrated by tossing his head coach Mike Crowder

to the ground in a popular wrestling victory celebration between coach and wrestler. In total, three Lincoln wrestlers placed at the state championships, with Lincoln's Zakary Juardo placing 5th and Sayuri Caceres placing 3rd.














ORCHESTRA!!!


