Lincoln NJROTC had the honor of meeting John Sabados, the oldest veteran in Tallahassee, at his 100th surprise birthday celebration hosted by the Southwood Veterans Association. Upon his entry to the event, six Lincoln NJROTC cadets served as his honor guard, giving him a military welcome fitting for one of our last surviving World War Two veterans. Mr. Sabados served in the U.S. Navy during WW2 in the Pacific Theatre fighting the Japanese. He served as a dispatcher with Air-Sea Rescue divisions; they flew helicopters rescuing Sailors and Airmen and returning them safely to shore.

Mr. Sabados was only on one ship in his entire career in the Navy, that ship was known as the U.S.S Missouri (BB63). His single cruise, however, proved to be quite momentous. John was on the "Big Mo" when it sailed into Okinawa Japan for the signing of the Instrument of Surrender by the Japanese forces, officially ended the war in the Pacific. The experience was extremely exciting for our cadets, and they all thoroughly enjoyed themselves. A special thanks to our Superintendent Rocky Hannah for inviting us to be a part of this event.


