We also completed testing including our progress monitoring, AP and end of course exams. This year we are giving over 1300 AP exams to more than 650 students in twenty-

Lincoln students also had a terrific semester in fine arts. The spring arts programs excelled in drama, chorus, orchestra, and band performances. Do you already play a string instrument? GREAT...we place students in orchestra based on playing ability. Therefore, you will be learning alongside fellow string players with similar playing experiences.





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


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
