Dear LHS Parents, Guardians, and Students,

As you read this year's final issue of *The Heat*, the staff and students of LHS feel like we are in a jet flying toward EOC's, final exams, graduation, building renovations, and summer vacation. Our LHS class of 2019 excitedly looks forward to their next steps in life, our juniors impatiently wait to become the next LHS Senior Class of 2020, and there is a group of 8th graders, about a mile from here, who reluctantly anticipate making the move to LHS. We have had a great school year which has been marked with a number of successes, both academically and in extracurricular activities. As this school year draws to an end, there is much change on the horizon. If you have been to campus recently, you may have seen the construction fencing that has been put in place. Immediately after graduation in May, construction crews will be coming into LHS to begin our summer renovation. The summer facelift includes a new roof, all new HVAC systems, a total front office renovation, installation of the new touch panel instructional boards, and secure enclosures on the front and back of H-Hall. All of these improvements are meant to increase the security, comfort, and educational opportunities in our classrooms. Beginning May 31, all LHS offices will be moved to LMS for the summer. We do not have a projected reentry date yet, but we will make sure we let you know when we do. Once school begins next year, our new ten-classroom and auxiliary gym addition will begin. This new construction will have some effect on everyone as we will have to change parking and traffic patterns during construction. We will be sending out updates and changes as they occur. We are excited about these much-needed changes that are coming, and we thank our WCSD Board of Education and ELOST penny tax for making these important upgrades possible.

To the parents of our LHS Seniors, I wish a great last month of school for you and your children. LHS CHROMEBOOK COLLECTION DAY

With the school year coming to an end soon, we will be collecting the school Chromebooks for the summer. In preparation for Chromebook Collection Day, here is some important information.

Seniors:

- Seniors will turn in their Chromebooks and chargers after they
 complete their last final exam either on Tuesday, May 21 or
 Wednesday, May 22. There will be a table set up in the cafeteria
 to collect the Chromebooks and chargers.
- The cost to replace a Chromebook charger is \$10.00. This fee can be paid with cash in the LHS Media Center or online at My Payments Plus.
- Chromebooks will need to be charged to 100%.
- If seniors are exempting their exams or are not taking classes on campus, they can return their Chromebooks before May 21.
- PSO, AP, WBL, and Hospital Homebound students who will not be on campus on the Chromebook Collection Day will need to bring their Chromebooks to the Media Center by May 24.
- Seniors will not be able to purchase their Chromebooks.
- Students will need to pay for lost/stolen/damaged Chromebooks anytime between now and May 22. Fees can be paid in the LHS Media Center in cash or online at www.mypaymentsplus.com. If parents/students purchased the Chromebook Usage and Protection Plan, the fees are as follows:

Underclassmen:

- Underclassmen will turn in their Chromebooks in advisement on Friday, May 24.
- PSO, AP, WBL, and Hospital Homebound students who will not be on campus on the Chromebook Collection Days, will need to bring their Chromebooks to the Media Center by May 24.
- Chromebooks will need to be charged to 100%.
- Underclassmen will not have to turn in the Chromebook charger blocks and cables. They will need to store them in a safe place over the summer, so that they will have them next year to charge their Chromebooks.
- Underclassmen will be getting their same Chromebooks back next school year.
- If underclassmen know they are withdrawing over the summer, they are responsible for paying for the damaged/lost Chromebooks when they withdraw. They will also need to turn in their Chromebook chargers or pay \$10.

Students are required to take state-mandated End-of-Course Exams in the areas of Algebra, Geometry, US History, Economics, Biology, 9th Literature, and American Literature. Failure to take these exams will cause you to receive an Incomplete.

AP Exams Advanced Placement exams will be administered May 6-17.

SUMMER CREDITS:

Students planning on taking summer classes through schools other than Walton County Public Schools (Faith Academy, Foothills Charter High School, etc.) must receive prior authorization from their counselors. Failure to receive course approval may result in students not receiving credit for the course taken. Classes taken at Loganville High School during summer Intersession are exempt from this policy.

ATTENTION SENIORS!

There are many activities and deadlines this month, so please review the senior letter that was emailed and sent home. If you have additional questions email Lori Sargent at Isargent@walton. k12.ga.us.

Senior Boards:

Each year we distribute senior boards for parents (or friends or family members) to decorate for their seniors. Boards are decorated with pictures and memories and anything to celebrate seniors. Parents come to hang the board on Friday, May 10 from 6:00-7:00 pm in the cafeteria area. This year we are asking that you hang the boards on COMMAND hooks, either by punching holes at the top of the board to hang on the hooks OR by punching holes for a ribbon to then hang on a hook, or **COMMAND strips.** We are asking that no tape be used this year, so PLEASE bring your own Command hooks/strips to display the boards. Staff will be available to assist you with where to place the boards. Do not use boards larger than what we distribute to seniors. The boards were distributed at lunch on April 10-11.

Senior Letters:
