Dear Parents, Guardians, and Students,



AP® SCHOLAR AWARDS

Fifty-Four students at Loganville High School have earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP Exams.

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program® (AP®) provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP Exams.

At Loganville High School:

Three students qualified for the National AP Scholar Award by earning an average score of 4 or higher on a five-point scale on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams. The students are Abigail Lassiter, Brett Pietruszka, Cale Strickland.

Fifteen students qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. These students are Averi Allred, Callie Bolemon, William Greene, Anderson Holcomb, Abigail Lassiter, Amiah Lewis, Jennifer Mullis, Austin Patterson, Hunter Peoples, Brett Pietruszka, Frank Pina, Adara Sewell, Kyle Starnes, Cale Strickland, Alexandra Zerylnick.

Ten students qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams. Twenty-nine students qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams with scores of 3 or higher. Of this year's award recipients at LHS, twenty-one were juniors (pictured). These students have one more year in which to complete college-level work and possibly earn a higher-level AP Scholar Award.

AP provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced placement and stand out in the college admission process. Each exam is developed by a



committee of college and university faculty and AP teachers, ensuring that AP Exams are aligned with the same high standards expected by college faculty at some of the nation's leading liberal arts and research institutions. More than 3600 colleges and universities annually receive AP scores. Most four-year colleges in the United States provide credit and/or advanced placement for qualifying exam scores. Research consistently shows that AP students who score a 3 or higher on AP Exams (based on a scale from 1 to 5, with 5 being the highest) typically experience greater academic success in college and have higher college graduation rates than students who do not participate in AP.

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

When determining the HOPE average, HOPE considers grades from all core curriculum courses attempted: Math, English, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language. Academic electives are also included (Journalism, Mythology, Psychology, etc.) when factoring the HOPE grade point average.

To determine HOPE eligibility, only grade point averages—not numerical averages—will be considered. Numerical grades on transcripts will be converted on the following scale:

Non AP Courses		**AP Courses (based on final grade)	
90-100	4.0	100-110	4.0
80-89	3.0	90-99	3.5
70-79	2.0	80-89	2.5
60-69	0	0-79	.5

****HOPE** will subtract the 10 points added to AP classes and dual enrollment courses to determine the GPA and add .5 points. For example, a student earns an 85 in an AP class. This grade will then be recorded on the transcript as a 95. Hope will subtract the 10 points and calculate using the GPA for a B (3.0) and add .5 points. Thus, the GPA used to determine HOPE would be a 3.5.

To view your child's HOPE GPA, please visit GAFutures.org and click on MY HOPE GPA. (you will need your child's login information to access their information).

Hope & Zell Miller Scholarship Eligibility: Students must have a 3.0 HOPE GPA to be eligible for the HOPE Scholarship (please see above). Students must have a 3.7 HOPE GPA and a SAT score of a 1200 (combined math and reading on one SAT administration) or a 26 composite ACT score to be eligible. More information at GAFutures.org.



2020-2021 SCHEDULES

Any schedule change requests must be submitted by your student to their counselor prior to the 1st day of school. Counselors will do their best to accommodate schedule change requests, but please understand that not all requests can be accommodated. Students are not allowed to request schedules changes to change teachers or class periods. If your student is scheduled for a class they already have credit for, is missing a class they need to graduate, or needs to change the difficulty level of a class, please have them contact their counselor immediately. No schedule change requests will be allowed after school has started unless they are necessary for graduation purposes.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

The State of Georgia has adopted new Dual Enrollment eligibility and participation guidelines. If your student is interested in participating in dual enrollment courses, you can go to <https://www.gafutures.org/media/188193/de-faqs-may-2020-1.pdf> for more information or have them speak to their counselors. Students planning to register for Dual Enrollment classes should check with their counselors concerning classes they should register for and graduation requirements. Students should complete the registration and funding applications early so they can get spots in the classes they want. ****Seniors taking classes at Toccoa Falls should make sure to register for Session A for any classes that are required for graduation.**

SENIOR NEWS

FAFSA: Students now have access to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Students should complete the application as soon as possible. The FAFSA can be viewed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students will need a PIN (personal identification number) to sign the FAFSA online: www.pin.ed.gov.

College Applications: Students will begin completing college applications soon. Many applications require a counselor and/or teacher recommendation. Please make sure your student submits a resume or student profile to the counselor and/or teacher with any recommendation forms. Requests for counselors to complete a recommendation must be received two weeks before the deadline to ensure enough time is given to write a thorough letter.

Transcripts: Transcripts for college admissions may be requested on <https://www.gafutures.org> (in-state) or www.parchment.com (all others). More information for Parchment can be found on the LHS website under counseling. These transcripts will be sent electronically and are considered official. Unofficial transcripts can be viewed by students in their Infinite Campus accounts.

Scholarships: Please see scholarship search information on the LHS website under counseling. All Seniors received a link and code to join a Scholarship Schoology page, where links to new scholarships will be listed. Have your student contact their counselor if they would like to join this group.

GEORGIA ALL-STATE CHEERLEADERS ANNOUNCED

Maliyah Henry and Madeline Robison of Loganville High School were recently selected to the (5A-7A) All-State cheerleading team at the Georgia Cheerleading Coaches' Association (GCCA) annual competition held virtually on September 20, 2020. Nominated by cheer coach Allison Creel-Clements, they competed against over 100 other senior cheerleaders from high school programs across Georgia. The first portion of the competition was based on a scholarship application. The students then competed virtually through video submission and zoom interviews, and the top 30 cheerleaders were selected as finalists. The finalists were judged in an interview and presented a two-minute routine, which showcased their cheering skills. The sixteen All-State cheerleaders were announced on social media after the completion of the competition. The All-State cheerleading squad will be presented at the conclusion of the Georgia High School Association Cheerleading State Championships in Columbus, Georgia, on February 16, 2021. At that time, the GCCA will announce the Georgia Cheerleader of the Year, the top scorer in the All-State competition, and all of the scholarship winners. The Georgia Cheerleading Coaches' Association annually awards scholarships of over \$7,400.00 to the GCCA All-State Squad.

SCHOOLGY

Teachers no longer use traditional web pages - instead, they utilize Schoology for online communications with students and parents. Schoology is a learning management system (LMS) which allows students and teachers to interact online both in and outside of the classroom. Through Schoology, teachers can post course content, provide resources for students, and review assignments. Students log in to access their class resources. They can submit assignments, take quizzes and participate in online discussions.

Each student has access to their classes utilizing a Schoology account. It is also possible to set up a parent account that allows you to see all of your student's assignments, announcements from teachers, etc. Parents should not utilize their student's Schoology account as it is also related to their school work, etc.

If parents do not already have a Schoology account, go to <https://app.schoology.com/register.php> and click **Parent** to register.

1. You will need a one-time Access Code to set up the account. Please email scrowe@walton.k12.ga.us to get the code.
2. Fill out the form with your information.
3. Click **Register** to complete.

When you use a Parent Access Code to create an account, you are automatically associated with your child. You can add

additional children to your account using the "Add Child" button.

Note: If your children attend different schools that are not in the same district (or are not part of the same Schoology Enterprise account), you will see the following error message when you attempt to use the **Add Child** button to link your account to theirs:

Parents must have an account at each of their children's schools. For example, if you have one child at a High School, and one child at a Middle School, you must have accounts at both schools and then link your accounts together. The feature enables you to toggle between accounts without having to log out and back in, and it lets each school separately manage your parent accounts and then communicate with you as necessary.
