Principal's Message

Greyhound Family!

I hope this newsletter finds you and your family doing well as we prepare for the end of the 2019-2020 school year. As each day passes and we approach our goals, both school and personal, I am pleased to say that all of our tracking systems are showing growth for our students. Our vision is to "Inspire Learning" at Lyman High School, and it is evident that our teachers are working hard to ensure that learning is happening and our students are benefiting from the inspiring instruction taking place in each classroom.

As you read through my message and peruse this newsletter, you are going to find that not only are we able to celebrate the great things that are currently happening, but you will also find that we are still receiving more and more outstanding news from the past year. As your principal, I love my job, and you - our students, staff, families and community have all become a part of my family, which makes every day a great Greyhound day. I am proud of each student and look forward to seeing your continued growth as we approach the end of the year. For some of you, this is the end of your public school career as you prepare to walk across the stage at graduation. For others, this is another year of learning, another year of growth, and another feather in your cap, which will eventually lead to donning the bright blue cap and gown at your graduation ceremony. Stay focused on your goals and you will achieve success.

As mentioned, we have received a few awards and accolades over the past few months. In January, the Florida Department of Education released the Graduation Rate for our most recent graduating class. Because of the hard work and dedication of our incredible Greyhound family (teachers, staff, students, and families), our Graduation Rate increased by 2.4%, earning Lyman HS the highest ever Graduation Rate of 94.4% (2017 - 87.8%, 2018 - 92%, 2019 - 94.4%). Our Grad Rate ranks us in the top 3 large high schools in Seminole County. What an outstanding achievement!

In January, we also learned that our Academy of Engineering was once again named a Magnet School of Distinction by the Magnet Schools of America! This achievement is awarded to "schools that demonstrate an exemplary commitment to academic standards, curriculum innovation, desegregation/diversity efforts, specialized teaching staffs and parent and community involvement." We are fortunate to have some of the best teachers, leaders, and students who continue to make our Academy of Engineering shine.

As we plan for the future, you may have heard that the governor of Florida released information on the new standards, which have been titled "The B.E.S.T. Standards". At this time, our job as a school, both students and staff, is to stay the course. Our current students will still be tested on the Florida Standards through the FSA and EOC's, just as they have been for the last several years. The first round of implementation of "The B.E.S.T. Standards" and new testing requirements will not be until the 2021-2022 school year, and the new tests designed for the new standards will not be complete until the 2022-2023 school year. For many of our students, they will be long graduated before any of this is implemented, but I wanted to make sure you had the latest information.

Senior parents - May 21st, Graduation Day, is quickly approaching! This is an exciting time for you and your child, and our hope is that we can do everything possible to make this a memorable event that will be cherished forever. Guidance & Student Services

SOMETHING TO CHEW ON FROM LYMAN'S SCHOOL COUNSELING TEAM.....

As we race to the finish line, our Student Services team is committed to helping your student meet their graduation requirements and prepare for next year. Your student has been registering for next year's classes, preparing for state assessments, wrapping up their classes... and we are dedicated to helping them meet these goals. There is a lot going on this time of year, so check out our Student Services updates and mark your calendars!

Course Registration – All students registered for their elective courses in the media center through their science classes. If your student was absent on their assigned registration day, please have them contact their counselor during lunch or break to sign up for their classes. Please note that all academic courses (math, science, English and social studies) were input based on the recommendation of their current teachers. Your student will also have been assigned a Reading class if they scored a 1 or 2 on their last FSA Reading exam.

GPA Recognition Lunch – We are proud to announce that we recently recognized over 300 students with a Chick-fil-a lunch for earning a 4.0 or above GPA in the 1st semester. Keep up the good work, Greyhounds!

Greyhound Scholars – Congratulations to the top 82 seniors awarded the Greyhound Scholars award! The ceremony will be April 29th.

SAT - Our March 4th Junior in school day SAT was a success! You can check out their scores in early April on their College Board account. If your student has not already created an account, they can do so at Collegeboard.org.

Attendance/Credit Denial – If your student accumulates 10 or more unexcused absences in any class, they are denied credit for that class (assuming they passed the class). All students who lost credit due to attendance were sent home a notification letter in early January. This letter provided the Saturday school make up days/times and also outlined how many hours per class are needed to regain credit. If you are not sure if your student was denied credit, please contact Ms. Scharnberg in the Administration Office. It is also important to note that we can only notify parents of attendance concerns via email and mail if your contact information in Skyward is current. Any updates/changes can be made by contacting Student Services directly and completing a change of address form.

SSC Decision Day Senior Field Trip – We took senior students on our annual Seminole State College informational tour fieldtrip on February 14th. They toured the campus to learn more about programs, clubs, admissions procedures and financial aid opportunities.

We appreciate all your hard work and efforts to ensure that your student is successful in high school. As collaborators in this process, we encourage you to reach out to us or your student's teachers with any concerns. Communication is key!

Math Department

The math department would like to welcome several new teachers that have joined our awesome faculty. Christy Malandra – Algebra 1 and Geometry; Marcus Santiago – Algebra 1 and Algebra 1 Honors; and Ben Schwerer – Liberal Arts Math 2. We would also like to welcome back Nydia Medina to give additional support to our students.

It's hard to believe we are almost to Spring Break, and summer will be here before we know it. All of the teachers are busy preparing our students for upcoming assessments for each class as we move into Quarter 4 and the testing begins with End-Of-Course Exams (FSAs) for Algebra 1 and Geometry, Advanced Placement Exams, and common final assessments for the rest of our courses. Science Department

Lyman is very excited that one of our students was selected as a Sunshine State Scholar and will be representing Seminole County. Kate Walsh will represent all of Seminole County at the Sunshine State Scholar Award ceremony in May.

Lyman science students attended the Astronaut Challenge and brought home 1st Place!

The advanced placement biology classes have been studying DNA replication and biotechnology. The students learned how plasmids can be transferred into bacteria. The students were able to see bacteria that had incorporated a glow gene (from a jellyfish) into their own genome and were able to glow. The students are now beginning their study of evolution and how amino acid sequences can be used to show lineage between organisms.

The biology teachers are working to prepare their students for the end of course exam in May. The biology students are currently studying classification, plants, and energy transfer. The students will be dissecting flowers and learning how plants are able to produce glucose through photosynthesis.

AP Environmental Science

I am excited to announce that we have been approved for our field trip to the Altamonte Springs Science Incubator (Lake Lotus Park and Water Reclamation Facility) on Monday, February 24th. Thanks to a grant, students can attend the field trip free of travel cost! Altamonte Springs Science Incubator (AS2I) is an innovative program promoting career readiness in the high-tech, high-demand fields of science, technology, engineering and math (S.T.E.M.). AS2I offers real-world, hands-on activities and experiences for high school students annually. The program serves as an extension of the traditional classroom and aims to foster curiosity and expand knowledge in the sciences. Seniors who attend the field trip will have an opportunity to apply for a scholarship opportunity (\$1,500). Juniors who attend the field trip will have summer internship opportunities.

The anatomy and physiology classes have been studying the nervous system. The students dissected a sheep brain and a cow eye. The students will soon be studying the circulatory system and will dissect a cow heart.

Social Studies Department

Juniors taking U.S. History learned about the 1950s and 60s during the 3rd quarter, studying topics including the Cold War, the Civil Rights Movement, the Kennedy and Johnson presidencies and the beginnings of the Vietnam War. Although 4th quarter will cover the expanding global influence of the United States as well as the social and economic development of American society since 1970, students will also be reviewing and preparing for the end-of-course exam. Mr. Casesa, Ms. Emerick, Ms. Ladd and Mr. Thomas will be presenting study strategies and visiting different classes during April as part of Lyman's first U.S. EOC exam "boost camp." The computer-based Florida EOC assessment in U.S. History will be administered in May. Scores will be released in early July and contribute to 30% of each student's final grade in the course. In the meantime, consider challenging your juniors to watch the game show Jeopardy! with you at home to brush up on details and show off how much they've learned.

Please keep an eye on their grades as both courses are required for graduation. Those who registered to vote last fall, chose a party affiliation and have already turned 18 will be eligible to vote in the Florida primary beginning with early voting on March 7th. ESOL

Lyman has a vibrant ESOL program for our students who are learning English. At any given time, there are students from five continents improving their skills in English while taking regular classes for their Lyman diploma. February is our busiest month with state and national testing almost each week. Once testing was completed, a group of high-achieving students attended a matinee performance at the Shakespeare Theatre in Orlando.

Engineering

Environmental Sustainability (ES) – Students have been working all nine weeks on DNA structure, protein synthesis, polymerase chain reaction (PCR) and gel electrophoresis. This work will culminate in a lab that will have students trying to identify if a specific food item has a gene for a GMO (genetically modified organism) embedded in the chromosome of the plant. We will test different items from Doritos to pet food. Students will set up a PCR to make copies of the GMO DNA segments and they will run an electrophoresis gel to obtain the results. We can't wait to find out if their food has a GMO present.



Career and Technical Education

On Saturday February 1, 2020 Lyman High School Automotive students participated in the Universal Technical Institute (UTI) Top Tech Competition. This is a contest that covers the Southeast United States. They take a written contest and then proceed to various stations including Electrical, Brakes, Air Conditioning, Engine Performance, and Engine Repair. This year out of 24 teams, the team of Lyman Juniors Tim Bottelman and Ulric Skinner placed Seventh. Each earned a \$1,000 scholarship.

For the second year in a row Lyman Automotive took home the top award with Seniors John Tinaro and Alessis Ward taking First Place. Each student earned a \$10,000 Scholarship. John was also recognized as being the only student with a perfect written test score. Alessis is the first female to ever place in this competition. The Lyman Automotive Program was awarded a Tool box and Tools worth thousands of dollars.

Lyman was the only school to have two teams both in the top ten.

In the six years that this competition has been happening, Lyman Automotive Service Technology has placed five of six times. Three times First place, once in Second and once in Third. The only year Lyman didn't place, we didn't compete due to a conflict.



ESE Department

Several students were surprised at their grades at the end of the quarter. Some don't realize the affect that one zero or several zeros have on the grade. Some students have had difficulty being successful in the third quarter. The demands are rigorous and students are held responsible for their academic success or failure. It takes teamwork by the student, parents, teachers and staff to achieve success. When students are not successful, usually it is because one of the areas listed below needs improvement. Students are required to:

- Attend school daily.
- Arrive to class on time with all the required materials, including completed homework assignments.
- Complete projects, class work and homework assignments in a timely manner.
- Utilize their planner to maximize their time efficiency.

- Keep materials organized. Some students may need parental help in this area on a regular basis (like once a week).
- Study to prepare for test. Preferably students will review notes nightly, rather than just studying the night before the test.
- Communicate their needs and concerns to their teachers and parents.

Athletics

After returning from the holiday break, Athletics was able to honor 99 scholar-athletes for their accomplishments in the classroom during the first semester. Each of these students earned a 4.0 gpa or higher while participating in competitive sports. We're proud of their commitment to excellence in the classroom and on the field.

Most of our Winter sports have concluded, and we had a number of noteworthy performances by individual athletes and our teams. Boys Soccer player Brett Robertson was voted onto the All-Conference 1st Team. Senior Girls Basketball player M'kayla Patterson finished her career with 1,693 points scored. She was also voted onto the All-Conference 1st Team for the Seminole Athletic Conference. Ava Ager represented Lyman High School at the FHSAA State Championships for Girls Weightlifting. She finished 8th overall in the 101 lbs weight class! Finally, we had two wrestlers finish in 4th place at the district wrestling meet.
