

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Lee County's Teacher of the Year Samantha Hower/Mariner High School

Mariner High School art teacher Samantha Hower has been named the 2019 Teacher of the Year.

Mrs. Hower has worked in the district for seven years, including time at East Lee County High School in Lehigh Acres. But from the get-go at Mariner, her dream was to put the "A" into the STEM Academy, evolving the school's known focus on Science, Technology, Engineering and Math to include the arts.

During her day, she hops around in the industry certifications hallway, packing up her book bag to move from room to room, just like her nearly 200 students on campus. Here, she works predominately in the digital arts and is **helping students obtain certifications in programs like Photoshop**.

Hower started the school's **National Art Honor Society** and works with nearby elementary and middle school art programs. She serves also as a representative of the **Teachers Association of Lee County** and acts as a facilitator for professional learning communities, which is a small group of educators who work together to share best practices.

She sits on a couple of committees for the district office, and, for the last two years, her students have earned the highest scores in the district for the Advanced Placement course "2D Studio Art." She's also the chair of the three-person art department.



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2019-20 Attendance Policy

In an effort to ensure student learning through purposeful student engagement, students must be in school. Attendance and graduation are an integral part of what we do at Mariner as it goes hand in hand with student achievement. As such we want to make sure that students have every opportunity for success at Mariner by being in attendance for instruction. Our attendance policy outlines attendance expectations, privileges, tardies, skipping, and sign-outs.

At 5 Unexcused Absences (per semester) and/or 4 Tardies/Sign-Outs (per quarter) - The Assistant Principal in charge of attendance will send a letter home with the student and make parent contact.

At 10 Unexcused Absences (per semester) and/or 9 Tardies/Sign-Outs (per quarter) - The Assistant Principal makes parent and counselor contact. An attendance contract signed by student and parent/guardian is put in place with administration.

*We hold students accountable when they are in violation of the attendance policy by placing them on an attendance contract and taking away the following privileges:

- Homecoming Dance
- Grad Bash
- Prom
- Parking Permit (student must remit parking pass until further notice)
- Senior Picnic/Breakfast
- Extra-Curricular Activities
- Walking at Graduation
- Participation in Sports
- Temp Placement
- On-campus and school related off-campus activity.

*Students will be able to earn these privileges back with consecutive attendance to school, being on time for classes and limited sign outs for 30 consecutive days. Each day the student is absent, contract begins over with day 1. Failure to return a signed contract results in the loss of the same privileges above.

15 Unexcused Absences (per semester) and/or 9 Tardies/Sign-Outs (per quarter) - Social worker is notified and parent must attend an attendance review to discuss possible denial of credit.

Mariner Thespians

Our Triton Thespian team had a tremendous fall and is headed into an exciting spring season. This past December we headed to Broward County for a District Theatre Festival where 14 students competed in a variety of events, including several Ensemble and Duet Acting scenes, Solo Musical, Costume Construction and Student Directed Scene. Interact Club

Interact club was very busy during first semester with food drives, Pennies for Patients, Habitat For Humanity, and Holidays Without Hunger.

Our annual Pennies for Patients ran from September 9th through 27th, for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society of Southwest Florida. Each 7th period class was given a donation box to collect weekly monetary donations. Interact collects and counts each box over the three-week campaign period and announces weekly class leaders. Once all donations were collected, we were able to donate \$139.54 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society.



Senior Final Exam Exemption Criteria 2019-2020

The following exam exemption policy applies to **seniors only**. If you have a **senior** who meets the exemption criteria, the student receives an X for the exam in FOCUS. This policy excludes Dual Enrollment, AP, IB, or AICE Exams.

Seniors who meet the following criteria are exempt from final exams:

- Only seniors can waive second semester exams.
- Student must have an A or B average in the class for second semester.
- Student must have no external suspensions during semester 2.
- Advanced Placement, IB, AICE, and Dual Enrollment exams must be administered. No exemptions
 can be given for these courses.
- When an exam is waived, the two nine-week grades for second semester will be averaged to obtain a semester average for the course.
- Only those seniors who meet the criteria as stated above will be exempt from exams at the end
 of second semester.
