2022 at the Gaylord Texan Resort and Convention Center.

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

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# Sports Highlights

### Wrestling

The 2021-22 wrestling season was a success. The team successfully transitioned from the longtime hall of fame coach Dave Phillips to Coach French. The team finished with a dual meet record of 26-11. This was the most dual wins in school history. The Tritons also brought back the Best of the West trophy as we reclaimed the title of being the best wrestling team in Cape Coral. The team also took 1st place at



the Tiger Duals in Palmetto. Clark Daley and Chaos Sanchez were very close to state births and should be in the hunt for a state medal next season. Mariner qualified 3 athletes for the state tournament. Senior captain Isaiah Castro earned a trip to the state tournament. He wrestled tough for the Tritons all season long and did the same at the state tournament. Freshman Maximus Brady was crowned the 113 pound Florida 2A state champion. He compiled a 54-2 record in his freshman campaign. During the state tournament, Maximus had 1 pin, 2 technical falls, and an 8-1 victory decision in the state finals. He only allowed one point in the entire state tournament. Junior captain Christopher Minto finished his perfect season with a record of 55-0. This was Christopher's second straight Florida state title. He also set the singleseason win record with his 55 victories. The team finished in 7th place as a team at the state tournament. The future is bright for Mariner wrestling as both state champions will be returning next season and many younger athletes will be making their own mark on Florida wrestling.











### **Boys Soccer**

After one of the roughest starts in recent history, the boy's soccer team came together at the right time to take its 5th district title in a row and make an appearance in the regional finals. Behind the leadership of Samuel Bedoya and Caden Sandrus the team stayed competitive and in good spirits even in those tough losses. Towards the end of the season seniors Nico Casallas, Mathias Arias and Dominic Shannon started contributing strong minutes to the team and leading the underclassmen into what would turn out to be a championship team. The boys never lost their fighting edge and believe that together they could achieve what they set out to do from the very beginning. The season-ending game at Tampa Jesuit was a lot closer and more competitive than the score indicated, unfortunate it was not enough to propel the team into the state final four, but the boys walk away from the season with their heads high knowing that they left it all on the field.







### Girls Soccer

It was a season for the history books. The girls were able to win the first state championship for any team in school history after a fantastic 22-3 season. The ladies faced a little adversity losing the district championship in a narrow, hard-fought contest but bounced back in the strongest way possible. They played a near-perfect



postseason conceding 0 goals and were powered by a young, dominant attacking quartet who scored 14 goals in 5 games. This is a team built for future success with depth as we are only losing two Seniors and will look to build upon this year's success.



### Baseball

"The Boys Baseball Team is looking to build on last year's success which captured a District Championship and a Regional Final appearance. The Tritons return a great nucleus of players including Matt Morales (Sr.), Sam Duvall (Sr.), Zack Mills (Sr), Matt Diaz (Sr). In addition, Tayler Hawkins (Jr), Cole Sandifer (Jr), Gavin Ziccardi (So.), Anthony Pimentel (So.), Mason Blackburn (So.) all saw some Varsity action last year and are looking to build on last year's success. The Tritons have been blessed with move-ins Ryan Retzloff (Sr.), Jayce Blasetti (Jr.), and Landon Johnston (Jr.), as they all will create depth on our team. Players participating in their first Varsity season include Isaac Lopez (Fr.), DJ Dwire (Fr.), Sam Guth (So.) Anthony Velazquez (Jr), will all see action early to get us prepared to make another post-season run. So far, the Tritons are 4-4 on the season and have been battletested early by playing some playoff-caliber teams early. As we approach Spring Break, we hope to get into mid-season form, make a push to finish the season on a high note, and hopefully a post-season run.



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
