Dear Matanzas High School Parents and Students.

It is hard to believe that we are in the 4th quarter of the school year! This year has gone by so fast, and we have so much to celebrate at MHS this year. As we approach the end of the year and start to feel the end in sight and the weather warming up, I want to encourage our students to <u>FINISH STRONG</u>. The 4th quarter is an important quarter for students in all grade levels to ensure that all are on track to graduate on time.

In May, our 9th and 10th grade students will take the F.A.S.T. ELA Assessment (PM3) which will give us important data about our students' progress in ELA and allow 10th graders to satisfy their ELA graduation assessment requirement. Students in Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology and U.S. History will take their end of course exams, which are 30% of the grade in that course and are important for meeting graduation requirements and Scholar Diploma requirements. Teachers and students have been working all year to prepare us to excel on these assessments; we are all rooting for you!

The 4th quarter is also an important time to finish strong in your courses - if your student has fallen behind, take advantage of our free after school tutoring on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Tutors are certified teachers and bus transportation is provided, so don't hesitate to get the help that they need to excel! Our students who may need to make up for failing grades can plan to be at Matanzas with us in June for summer school - we will be reaching out to families in April and May to discuss those needs and make arrangements.

Please also plan to join us at The Ship for upcoming performances, banquets and other end of year activities for our students involved in activities and sports. From the musical *Grease*, to band, steelband, chorus concerts, and more, there are dozens of ways to celebrate our students' hard work and achievements this year. News from the Health Room

ANY MEDICATION THAT IS STUDENT-SPECIFIC (prescription or non-prescription) MUST BE SIGNED OUT BY A PARENT/GUARDIAN BEFORE 2:30 P.M. ON THE LAST DAY OF SCHOOL. If not signed out by 5/26/2023 ALL medication will be disposed of per policy.

**A SCHOOL ENTRY HEALTH EXAM (Physical) and a CERTIFIED FLORIDA IMMUNIZATION RECORD are REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS.

- Health Information should be updated each school year, as well as emergency contact information.
- Medication Flagler County School Board policy prohibits students from carrying any medication to school, from school, or during school.

If a student MUST have medication during school hours, appropriate paperwork/forms must be completed and a parent/guardian is required to bring the medication to the school. Unauthorized medication may be confiscated and reported to the Dean. Each medication must be in its original container and must match the doctor's order exactly.

**Epi-Pens, inhalers, diabetic medications and supplies, and pancreatic enzymes may be carried by the student with written authorization by a physician and the parent/guardian. The parent/guardian must complete appropriate paperwork with the school nurse IN ADVANCE of the student carrying these items. Any changes in medication must be in writing and brought to the clinic. This includes any over-the-counter medications such as Tylenol, Advil, cough drops, antacids, etc.

**ALL Diabetics MUST have a DMMP from their physician on file in the health room.

Please inform the nurse of any medical condition(s) for which your student may require treatment, especially if life-threatening.

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GUIDANCE NEWS

Seniors

You must complete your Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA- Bright Futures Application) BEFORE graduation, May 30, 2023. You also need at least 100 community service hours to qualify for the top Bright Futures award and qualifying SAT and/or ACT scores along with the other eligibility requirements that must be met by graduation. You must have your hours logged on your MHS transcript before graduation as well. Make sure you turn in your log sheets to Mrs. Moore, the Guidance Secretary, in the Upper Spot. Please be sure to register for the SAT and/or ACT to reach the scores needed to qualify. Students going for the Gold Seal Bright Futures award will also need to complete the FFAA application before graduation, turn in at least 30 community service hours, and earn qualifying test scores along with the other eligibility requirements. 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
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STEELBAND CONTINUES TO AMAZE

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
