# Message from the PRINCIPAL

Happy Holidays, Pirate Nation!

While these are difficult times, we still have much to celebrate and be thankful for this holiday season. We finalized our graduation rate for last year, and we ended up with 95.30%. That is 409 out of 429 students who entered Matanzas High School as a freshman in 2016! Despite the challenge of the pandemic in the final quarter of the school year, our students rose to the occasion. Two key areas of growth for us are our students with disabilities; their graduation rate is 90%, and our African American rate is 93%. Congratulations to the class of 2020 seniors, parents, and staff for their hard work and determination. Together we were able to help make these students' dreams come true.

As we turn the corner and head into 2021, don't grow weary of continuing to focus on personal safety and academics. We must continue to follow our three steps here at The Ship and at home: *Mask up, Wash up, and Back up*. Remember if you cannot be more than six feet away, wear a mask or face covering. Frequently wash your hands or use hand sanitizer to avoid the spread of infectious diseases. Whenever possible back up, giving yourself and others some space. I know it's been a very challenging year, but together we can be the difference in helping stop the spread of Covid-19. Don't allow fatigue to set in. Let's continue to focus on the things we can control and help each other be our best in the new year!

While learning during this time is anything but routine, whether students are remote, face to face, hybrid, or enrolled in IFlagler, we all must stay vigilant in our academic efforts.
