


#### SAVE THE DATE! Wednesday March 1, 2023 is the Junior in school SAT day.

- You don't need to do anything to register for the SAT; MHS has taken care of your registration and payment.
- The tests begin promptly at 8:10 AM, so be in your testing room ٠ well BEFORE 8:10 AM.
- Don't forget to get a good night's rest, eat a healthy breakfast, and come prepared! You can bring a drink and snacks for break times. Bring layers! Some testing rooms can be cold or warm!
- Check Schoology for your testing location (information will be available closer to the testing date).
- If you would like to take SAT and/or ACT on a scheduled Saturday ٠ test date, you need to register for the exam on your own. Remember that if you qualify for free/reduced lunch, you can request a fee waiver from Mrs. Moore, the Guidance Secretary, located in the upper spot!
