#### Happy Fall, Pirate Nation!

With the first nine weeks behind us and as we head into the second nine weeks, here are a few helpful tips that will keep your students on track and prepared when it is time to return to campus.

- Set (and keep) a schedule. The closer this is to a 'school schedule,' the easier it will likely be on everyone.
- 2. Make sure your student has the materials necessary to complete all assignments.

Internet access, textbooks, and workbooks are all critical to your student's success.

- **3.** Provide an environment conducive to learning. This isn't always easy. If your student is too isolated, it is difficult to check in with them. If they are at the kitchen table, depending on the child or their environment, they may be too distracted.
- Make sure all work is completed. Double-check Skyward frequently and help your student follow up with their teachers regarding any missing assignments.
- 5. Help your student check messages and communicate with school.

Schoology is a great place to start! The morning announcements are posted daily. Our website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts are also great resources. When all else doesn't work, call the front office; we will be happy to assist with any question you may have. Communication is the key!
