Attendance, **Tardiness, & Going Home Early**

When you combine the statewide school shutdown last spring of 2020 with quarantines, isolations, and the county-wide school shutdown in the Fall of 2020, students have missed a tremendous amount of faceto-face instruction. As a result, consistent attendance is more important than ever. Therefore, it is essential that students are on-time for school. Additionally, we have been seeing an increase in students leaving school early. With a school nurse stationed in the building full-time, it is essential that your child be evaluated in order to determine whether they truly need to go home. BUILD THE HABIT OF GOOD ATTENDANCE EARLY

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!



DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school – and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that getting to school on time every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to teachers and classmates before school starts.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomachache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors or other parents for advice on how to make him feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting your child to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in ses

M.H.S. Continues **Positive Behavior** Intervention **Strategies**

This year Maumee High

School has implemented our unique Positive Behavior Intervention Strategies (P.B.I.S.) Program. Now in our second year of full implementation, our program focuses on Four Main Behavioral (Responsible, **Expectations** Open-Minded, Appreciative, and Resilient) that are represented in our R.O.A.R. acronym. Staff have increased their attention to and efforts in recognizing students' positive behaviors. Also, much effort has been put forth in promoting R.O.A.R. throughout the school and incorporating the "Positivity Project" curriculum into targeted lessons in our 9th, 10th, & 11th grade homerooms. The senior class has had the opportunity to listen to guest speakers from the greater Toledo Community.

In the month of March the High School will transition to daily announcements about the importance of our Behavioral Expectations and providing students with ongoing examples of these expectations in our school building and on our school campus. Trivia Friday's in the cafeteria will focus on our Behavioral Expectations and students will have the opportunity to win valuable prizes.

German-American Virtual Exchange (G.A.V.E.) Program

For the second year in a row, Maumee High School 11th grade German honors students will have the opportunity to participate in a virtual exchange. This year, the Americans will be paired with German students who have similar interests. These students will have the opportunity to interview people in various careers: German students will be interviewing Americans in Maumee who have different jobs. American students will be interviewing city council members in Germany, as well as a member of the police department. This is a great way for students on both sides of the Atlantic to learn about potential future careers!

SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP LIST IN THE GRADUATION PROGRAM

MEDALLIONS, CORDS, STOLES AT THE 2022 GRADUATION CEREMONY

Maumee High School ONLY PERMITS THE USE OF SCHOOL ISSUED MEDALLIONS, CORDS, or STOLES at the graduation ceremony. No other adornments will be permitted at the graduation ceremony. Caps are not to be decorated.

Medallions at the Maumee High School Graduation Ceremony are reserved for those students who have earned an Ohio Honors Diploma. Freshman, Sophomores, and Juniors who want to be recognized with this distinction at their graduation ceremony should ask their school counselor if they are on track to earn an Ohio Honors Diploma. Counselors can make sure that they are registered for the appropriate courses to be eligible.

Cords at the Maumee High School Graduation Ceremony are reserved for those students who are active members of the National Honor Society (gold) or the National Technical Honor Society (purple).

Stoles at the Maumee High School Graduation Ceremony are reserved for those students who have earned a National Merit distinction as a national merit finalist, semifinalist, or commended scholar.

SENIOR COMMUNICATIONS

Seniors are responsible for checking their email regularly and following the <u>senior class website</u> (https://sites.google.com/a/maumeek12.org/maumeeseniorclass/). All seniors - early graduates, MHS, MHS-PCC, and MHS-CBI - are responsible for knowing the details for their senior events in the final ½ of the school year. Maumee City Schools has been doing awesome recycling plastic bags and other plastic film. To date, we have recycled 278 pounds of plastic film since September. Plastic bags can be dropped off at any Maumee City Schools building through April 30th. This will be the last day to recycle plastic at all Maumee City School buildings for this school year. After that date, we encourage people to continue to recycle this film at local retailers that accept plastic film recycling such as Meijer and Kroger. 



File a 2021 Tax Return to Get the Remainder of Your 2021 Child Tax Credit

Many families got up to half of their estimated 2021 Child Tax Credit as advance payments last year. Here are three steps to getting the rest of your credit:

Step 1: Review Letter 6419

- You should have received this letter in January 2022 if you received advance Child Tax Credit payments in 2021.
- It shows the amount of advance payments you received and the number of qualifying children the payments were based on.
- You or your tax preparer will use this information to figure your remaining credit accurately.
- If you misplaced your letter, you can look up your information using the IRS's CTC Update Portal or Online Account.

Step 2: Claim the Rest of Your 2021 Child Tax Credit

- File your 2021 federal tax return and claim the Child Tax Credit, if you're eligible.
- Choose direct deposit if you're getting a refund. Make sure your bank account information is correct.

Step 3: Get Paid!

- After you file your return, you can check on the status of your refund using the Where's My Refund? tool on IRS.gov or the mobile app IRS2Go.
- You can check within 24 hours of e-filing or within four weeks of mailing a return. Updates to the online tool are made daily, usually overnight.
- To use this tool, you need your Social Security number, filing status and the exact whole dollar amount of your refund.

Important Information

- » Filing a tax return is the only way to get the remainder of your 2021 Child Tax Credit.
- » Electronic filing with direct deposit is the safest and fastest way to get a tax refund.
- » Many people qualify for free e-filing through IRS Free File or at a volunteer tax preparation site.
