At MHS we are continuing our commitment to introducing our students to the power of positive psychology. Through the combination of the "Positivity Project" and Restorative Circles, we are providing a curriculum based on the tenets of positive psychology that introduces students to characteristics of positive people and positive cultures. Our goal is to make MHS an even more happy, accepting, and productive workplace for both students and adults by developing these characteristics. Since our last newsletter, we have covered RESILIENCE,



RESPONSIBLE & OPEN MINDED & APPRECIATIVE & RESILIENT

BRAVERY, and PERSPECTIVE. In the first homeroom of the month, teachers conduct guided discussions and activities focused on the specific character traits. Students are given a punch-card for the specific character trait of the month. Teachers and staff can punch/initial these cards if they catch their student(s) exhibiting the specific character trait. In the second homeroom of the month, homeroom teachers will follow-up with students to collect students' punch-cards and discuss what they did to get their cards punched and the impact these acts have had on them and others both in and out of school in a Restorative Circle activity.

Beginning in February, we will refocus our efforts on our "FOUR Behavioral Expectations" which are Be RESPONSIBLE, Be OPEN-MINDED, Be APPRECIATIVE, and BE RESILIENT. Daily announcements and Trivia games will occur during lunches where students can exhibit their knowledge and win valuable prizes.

Additionally, we have welcomed speakers from the greater Toledo Area to speak to our Senior Class about the monthly character trait. In November, 13ABC morning news anchor, James Sparks spoke about Resilience. In December, Springfield High School Teacher McKenna Reitz spoke to the seniors about Bravery. In January, Maumee High School's Assistant Principal, Scott Perrotte spoke about Perspective.

Senior Scholarship List in the Graduation Program

An important piece of the graduation program is the senior scholarship list. Every senior who receives a scholarship - whether they accept the scholarship or not - is recognized by name along with the scholarships awarded. We rely on the senior students and parents to provide this information as we may not always receive notice of scholarships that the students receive. Please bring a copy of any scholarship that your student receives to the counseling office at Maumee High School. You can also scan a copy of the letter and email to counseling office secretary, Michelle Leasor, at mleasor@ maumeek12.org We will make sure that all scholarships for which we have notice are properly listed by the student name in the program.



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Preparing for the State-Administered Junior ACT

All Maumee High School **Juniors** will be taking the state administered ACT test on **Tuesday, March 15th**. This will be a full-length ACT and - like any ACT test - it is designed to give students a critical assessment on their college readiness skills. ACT results are used (in conjunction with other metrics like grades, GPA, and difficulty of courses taken) to determine if a student is admitted to a college or university as well as scholarship opportunities.

Why does Maumee High School put so much emphasis on the ACT? Almost every college and university in the state of Ohio has a "Freshman Scholarship Calculator" that determines the base level renewable scholarship available to freshman students that is solely based on GPA and ACT scores. There are many more scholarship opportunities available to students that qualify, but this typically shows the basic academic award. The counseling staff at Maumee High School will work with students to make sure they are aware of other grants, scholarships, and endowments that they are eligible for.

ACT College Readiness BenchmarksEnglish - 18Mathematics - 22Reading - 22Science - 23Juniors are considered "college ready" if they meet ALL 4 of these subscores on the ACT.

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
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
