Positive Behavior Interventions Making a School-Wide Impact

Throughout the 2022-2023 school year, Maumee High School continued implementing the Positive Behavior Intervention System (P.B.I.S. Team). This system was developed by the Maumee High School P.B.I.S. team. Made-up of staff members, administrators, students, and a parent representative team has continued to work diligently throughout the pandemic to develop and enhance Maumee High School's Positive Behavior Intervention System.

A large part of the implementation of the Maumee High School P.B.I.S. focused on our **R.O.A.R.** acronym with explicit instruction, restorative practices, and classroom discussions that highlight our four Behavioral Expectations for Maumee High School Students: **Responsible, Open-Minded, Appreciative, and Resilient**. In addition, these behavioral expectations are supplemented with the Positivity Project, an initiative that introduces positive character traits and encourages the development of positive relationships. Additionally, the P.B.I.S. team implemented:

- A Positive Behavioral Expectation Matrix (available in the 23-24 Student Handbook)
- A System of Recognizing Positive Behaviors
- A Discipline Flow-Chart
- New Software for tracking positive and negative behaviors
- Curricular tools for teaching Behavioral Expectations

In May of 2023, the MHS P.B.I.S. participated in our third annual Tiered Fidelity Inventory. The Tiered Fidelity Inventory is designed to measure the fidelity and effectiveness of P.B.I.S. in our school. The implementation of P.B.I.S. involves a long-term commitment to a process of evaluation, planning, development and renewal to which the Maumee High School staff and administration is committed. We are proud to report the results of this year's T.F.I. was 97%, an improvement of 4% from last school year. Additionally, our school-wide discipline data was positively affected. For the entire 2022-2023 school year, an average of 97% of students at Maumee High School were cited for violating expectations 1 time or less each month. As a result of this promising data, Maumee High School has applied for the BRONZE Award for P.B.I.S. implementation for a second consecutive year.

GRADUATION

Graduation Requirements (Classes of '24 & '25, and '26 and Beyond) - Know What It Takes To Get A Diploma

1. **Required Coursework:** All students will satisfy the State of Ohio's curriculum requirements as well as the requirements of the Maumee City Schools. Students will complete 23 credits, with specific credits required in each content area, as set forth by the Maumee City Schools graduation policy:

English (1,2,3,4 series)	4 credits
Social Studies (1 credit World hist, 1 credit US hist, 1 credit US govt, and 0.5 credit Econ Including instruction in financial literacy)	3.5 credits
Science (1 unit physical, 1 unit life, and 1 unit advanced)	3 credits
Mathematics (algebra 1, geometry, algebra 2 or its equivalent, and 1 unit beyond)	4 credits
Health/Physical Ed.	1 credit
Visual/Performing Arts	1 credit
Electives	6.5 credits
Total Credits Required	23 credits

Credit requirements - Class of '26 & BEYOND

English (1,2,3,4 series)	4 credits
Social Studies (1 credit World hist, 1 credit US hist, 1 credit US govt, and 0.5 credit Econ 3.5 credits Including instruction in financial literacy)	3.5 credits
Science (1 unit physical, 1 unit life, and 1 unit advanced)	3 credits
Mathematics (algebra 1, geometry, algebra 2 or its equivalent, and 1 unit beyond)	4 credits
Financial Literacy (simultaneous credit w/ Econ)	0.5 credit
Health/Physical Ed.	1 credit
Visual/Performing Arts	1 credit
Electives	6.0 credits
Total Credits Required	23 credits

- 2a. **Competency demonstration by passing the state EOC tests:** Students must earn a "competency" score on the state Algebra I and English Language Arts II tests to graduate. Students who do not pass the test will be offered appropriate remediation and will retake the test at least once. If both tests are passed with a competency score, proceed to "3. Readiness Demonstration" below.
- 2b. **Alternative ways to demonstrate competency:** Students who did not achieve a competency score in the state's algebra and/or English 2 tests will have to try the test(s) a second time after remediation. If the student still cannot achieve a competency score after trying the test(s) a second

time, the student must demonstrate alternative competency through one of the selections (A, B, C) below:

- Obtain a remediation-free score in the math or English subject areas on the ACT or SAT.
 - Complete two (2) of the following options, with at least one (1) of the options being a foundational option:
 - **Foundational Options:** obtain proficient scores on three (3) or more WebXams in a single career pathway, earn a twelve (12) point approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials, or complete a pre-apprenticeship program recognized by the Ohio State Apprentice Council, a registered apprenticeship in the student's chosen career field, or show evidence of acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program restricted to participants eighteen (18) years of age or older.
 - **Supporting Options:** complete a 250-hour work-based learning experience with evidence of positive evaluations, earn the required score on WorkKeys, or earn the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal.
 - Enlist in the military and present evidence of a signed contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation.
 - Earn credit for a college-level math and/or college-level English course in the subject(s) not passed on the state exams through the College Credit Plus Program.
3. **Readiness Demonstration:** Students must demonstrate readiness for graduation by earning at least two (2) diploma seals, one (1) of which must include a State-approved seal from the following list:
- a. Seal of Biliteracy;
 - b. OhioMeansJobs - Readiness Seal;
 - c. Industry Recognized Credential Seal;
 - d. College Ready Seal;
 - e. Military Enlistment Seal;
 - f. Citizenship Seal;
 - g. Science Seal;
 - h. Honors Diploma Seal;
 - i. Technology Seal.

The Board offers the following additional seal(s) - which can serve as the second earned diploma seal - in accordance with adopted administrative guidelines:

- a. Community Service Seal;
- b. Fine/Performing Arts Seal;
- c. Student Engagement Seal.

These locally-defined seals cannot replace the requirement that each student must earn at least one (1) state-approved seal.

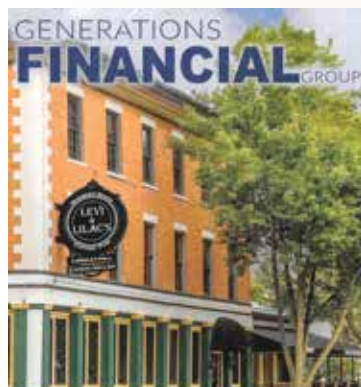
