

# Principal's Message: Garbage In; Garbage Out

In high school, I struggled in math. The problem wasn't that I couldn't do it. I simply did not want to do it. One math teacher required us to put our homework on our desk each morning so he could check if it was completed. More often than not, I did not have my homework. As he circulated through the classroom, he would mark in his gradebook whether each student did the homework. On those rare occasions when I did complete my homework, it was completed poorly and incorrectly. As he checked my homework, he



would mutter the phrase, "garbage in; garbage out." He knew I was not putting in the effort. As a result, I did not master the content. On more than one occasion, I had to retake a math course during summer school. I had no one to blame but myself.

I have found that conversations with students and parents/guardians peak towards the end of each trimester. These conversations usually stem from dissatisfaction with a current grade in a class. Interestingly, these conversations focus on the difficulty of the class, the teacher's high expectations, or the amount of homework. I always remind students and parents/guardians that our courses and curriculum is designed to be challenging. The goal is to stretch the abilities of students. A grade should be a representation of the student's level of mastery of the course content. This is why Maumee High School has such a rich academic reputation. The process is more important than the grade earned in a course. Nothing more.

With this in mind, Trimester Exams at MHS are this week Wednesday, November 8th and Thursday, November 9th. Final exams represent the last opportunity for students to exhibit their mastery of course content. It is also the last chance to improve their final grades in their first trimester classes. Please encourage your student(s) to begin studying this week in order to avoid cramming in the final days. Students should try to get a good night's sleep so they are fresh and ready to go on exam days.


### Maumee High School's "8th Grade Open House"

### **MHS Students at PENTA**

Maumee High School administration has been working diligently to improve the quality and level of communication between MSH and our students at PENTA. This year we have worked so that the daily announcement bulletin is being emailed to PENTA students' email addresses. Additionally, we have asked for the daily announcement bulletin to be posted in the Maumee Display case in PENTA's cafeteria. ### **MHS Cafeteria Prices Increase**

In 2020 and 2021, the Federal Government passed three stimulus bills that provided funds to the Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER). Those funds have now dried up. As a result, Maumee City Schools Food Service will again charge for breakfast. The cost for breakfast at Maumee High School will cost \$1.50. Additionally, the cost for lunches has

increased as well. The price for a lunch at Maumee City Schools for the 2023-2024 school year will cost \$3.50. The Ohio Department of Education recently announced that families that are approved for reduced-price meals this school year will automatically receive FREE meals during the 2023-2024 school year. ### **MHS Student Fees**

Student fee invoices will be mailed home in September. Included with the invoice is a Free & Reduced Lunch Application. You are not obligated to complete this form, but if it does apply to you we ask that you complete the form and return it to the Maumee High School main Office.

Student parking tags are available for purchase for \$20. All student vehicles need to display a parking tag. Students need to fill out an application form that is available in the information & forms kiosk in the front entryway at MHS. Turn in the completed form to the MHS front office with \$20 and your student will get a parking tag that is good for the rest

### **General Information**

### **Maumee High School Athletics**

The Fall Sports' Season marks the beginning of our inaugural season in the Northern Buckeye Conference. Our athletic teams have competed very well in both non-league and league competition. The boys and girls soccer teams earned league championships with nine of the boys and eight of the girls earning league honors. Blake Wagener was named NBC Player of the Year! Both the boys and girls soccer teams won sectional titles and district championships. The girls soccer team went on to compete against Rocky River last night in the Regional Semi-Final. Although they did not come away with the win, we are so proud of the remarkable season our girls soccer team put together. Tonight the boys soccer team travels to Firelands Health Stadium in Sandusky to take on the Richfield-Revere in the Regional Semi-Final at 7pm.

In <u>Cross Country</u>, <u>Gabe Dario</u> and <u>Lucy Porter</u> earned NBC honors, and Lucy placed high enough at the district level to compete at regionals.

The Football team went 5-5 this year and missed the playoffs by two spots. The ALL NBC voting hasn't happened for football yet. In Volleyball, we had four All NBC selections and won the sectional title. Our <u>Girls Tennis</u> team won the NBC Tennis Tournament! The <u>Boys Golf</u> team had five All NBC honorees and placed second in the NBC Tournament as a team. The numbers for our <u>Girls Golf</u> team are improving, and all of the girls showed steady improvement throughout the entire season.

### M.H.S. Positive Behavior Intervention System (P.B.I.S.)

Positive Behavior Intervention Systems (P.B.I.S.) is a broad range of <u>systemic</u> and <u>individualized strategies</u> for achieving important social and learning outcomes in our school community while preventing problem behavior. The key attributes of PBIS include <u>preventive activities</u>, <u>data-based decision making</u>, and <u>a problem solving orientation</u> (Horner, 2000; Lewis & Sugai, 1999; Sugai et.al., 2000; Weigle, 1997).

- P.B.I.S. Reduces problem behavior
- P.B.I.S. Increases academic performance
- P.B.I.S. Improves the perception of safety
- P.B.I.S. Reduces bullying behaviors
- P.B.I.S. Improves students' social-emotional competence
- P.B.I.S. Increases positive school climate and culture

### **Graduation & Academic Recognition**

Graduating students at Maumee High School receive individual academic recognition at the graduation ceremony based on the Latin Honors System and the earning of a State of Ohio Honors Diploma. Every student who earns an honors diploma will receive an academic medallion at the graduation ceremony and will be recognized by name for that award. The earning of an honors diploma is NOT based on taking any honors courses, it is simply the culmination of 4 years of a prescribed college preparatory curriculum. To earn a state of Ohio academic honors diploma, the student must complete any 7 of the following 8 criteria:

- a. 4 units of English
- 4 units of math including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, & another higher level mathematics course or a four-year sequence of courses that contain equivalent content.
- c. 4 units of Science including two units of Advanced Science
- d. 4 units of Social Studies
- e. 3 units of the same Foreign Language or at least 2 units in two different languages.
- f. 1 unit of Fine Arts
- g. 3.5 Grade Point Average on a 4.0 scale
- h. 27 composite on the ACT

### **Community Service Documentation**

Maumee Middle School and Fort Miami Elementary School are designated as "schoolwide Title I served buildings."

100% of Maumee City Schools Teachers Meet All State Qualifications & Licensing Criteria - We are pleased to tell parents that 100% of Maumee City Schools teachers met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction. All of Maumee's paraprofessionals also meet all state licensure qualifications. If you have questions about the qualifications or licensure of staff members working with your child, please contact the building principal directly.

Title I Parent Participation - Maumee City Schools is always seeking ideas to help us improve parent involvement in events/programs, especially those funded using federal funds. 
