MHS Building Hours

The doors at MHS will open to students at 7:15 am. Bus riding students will be dropped off in the front loop and bus riders will enter through the Main Entrance. Students who walk, drive, or get dropped off only have two door options - the front entrance at MHS (door #1) or the athletic entrance (door #7). Breakfast is available for \$1.50. Classes start promptly at 7:40 am. If your student walks, drives, or is dropped off, make sure that they have enough time to get through to class before the tardy bell. **All walkers, drivers, and drop offs should be in the building by 7:35 am.** Students who are not involved in a supervised activity are expected to leave the building at 2:30pm. Our building closes at 3:30pm.

MHS Students at PENTA

From time to time, MHS students who attend PENTA feel left out of the information loop because they are not in the Maumee High School building on a daily basis. For this reason, communication is critical to ensure that the flow of information reaches all MHS students, including those who attend PENTA. Therefore, it is important for PENTA students to regularly check BOTH their Maumee High School & PENTA email accounts. Email is the first line of communication between MHS and MHS students at PENTA. My goal is for every student to feel as though they are a part of our school community. While you may attend classes at PENTA, you are still a Maumee High School student first and foremost.

MHS Students and Email

All MHS students need to start checking their school email DAILY from today forward. Email will be the most utilized form of communication between students, teachers, and parents.

MHS Cafeteria Prices Increase

In 2020 and 2021, the Federal Government passed three stimulus bills that provided funds to the Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER). Those funds have now dried up. As a result, Maumee City Schools Food Service will again charge for breakfast. The cost for breakfast at Maumee High School will cost \$1.50. Additionally, the cost for lunches has increased as well. The price for a lunch at Maumee City Schools for the 2023-2024 school year will cost \$3.50. The Ohio Department of Education recently announced that families that are approved for reduced-price meals this school year will automatically receive FREE meals during the 2023-2024 school year. 


Student fees will be mailed home in September. You can pay online through e-funds and the service fee has been waived.





Food Deliveries to MHS

Maumee High School does not accept outside food deliveries for students during the school day. Students are expected to bring lunch to school or purchase a school lunch. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

MHS Parking Passes

Student parking tags are available for purchase for \$20. All student vehicles need to display a parking tag. Students need to fill out an application form that is available in the information and forms kiosk in the front entryway at MHS. Turn in the completed form to the MHS front office with \$20 and your student will get a parking tag that is good for the rest of the school year. Parking tag enforcement will begin in September.

A Strong Start Can Prevent Struggles Later

Assure a strong start and successful school year by establishing a solid home-study routine with your student. Encouraging, supporting, and participating in this vital activity will improve your student's attitude and performance at school and support a work ethic that endures for a lifetime.

- 1. SET A SCHEDULE: Establish a regular time-slot for this important daily activity. Seek your child's agreement and commitment to reserve this time each day for homework and study. Encourage this habit. In many ways, it's his/her job and should become routine. Your support and involvement in your student's home-study effort makes a huge difference in the high school experience.
- CREATE THE ENVIRONMENT: Students can be easily distracted. Teach them to create an 2. atmosphere conducive for concentration. Having a defined study area works with some students but not all. The most important requirements are time, focus, and your support. Minimizing social media access, loud music, and other detractors will improve effectiveness and retention.
- 3. OBSERVE AND ENGAGE: Psychologists suggest that it takes three weeks to break or establish a habit. When school resumes this month, commit three weeks to this routine with your student. Make it become a habit for both of you. Your daily assistance and attitude toward school have a huge impact on your child's success.
- 4. BE ON TIME: School starts each day at 7:40 am promptly. Breakfast service runs from 7:15 am - 7:35 am. WHEN THE LED LIGHTS ABOVE THE FRONT DOORS TURN RED, your student is tardy and may face disciplinary consequences. The added stress and anxiety of being late is not healthy for your student. It does not make a difference "who's fault it is", students just need to be here with time to spare so that they can begin their day on a positive note, ready to learn.

After-School Tutoring & Quiet Study

MHS offers supervised after-school tutoring and quiet study opportunities every day from 2:30 - 3:30 pm. Transportation home is provided at 3:45 pm for students who are eligible to ride the bus (live more than 1 mile from the building). At 3:30pm, students who require a bus to take them home will be given a transportation ticket from the Supervising Teacher and can take that ticket to Maumee Intermediate School to catch a bus.

Graduation & Academic Recognition

Graduating students at Maumee High School receive individual academic recognition at the graduation ceremony based on the Latin Honors System and the earning of a State of Ohio Honors Diploma. Every student who earns an honors diploma will receive an academic medallion at the graduation ceremony and will be recognized by name for that award. The earning of an honors diploma is NOT based on taking any honors courses, it is simply the culmination of 4 years of a prescribed college preparatory curriculum. To earn a state of Ohio academic honors diploma, the student must complete any 7 of the following 8 criteria:

- 4 units of English
- 4 units of math including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and another higher level mathematics course or a four-year sequence of courses that contain equivalent content.
- 4 units of Science including two units of Advanced Science
- 4 units of Social Studies
- 3 units of the same Foreign Language or at least 2 units in two different languages. e.
- 1 unit of Fine Arts f.
- 3.5 Grade Point Average on a 4.0 scale g.
- 27 composite on the ACT h


