




### In the Know with the MPO!

### **Testing at MIHS**

**October 16th -** All grade 10 students will take the PSAT/ NMSQT here at MIHS. Grade 10 students are automatically signed up for it at no cost. Students should receive a Student Guide from their English teacher. You can also visit



https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt-psat-10 to download a copy of the student guide, see what kinds of questions will be on the test, and/or take additional practice tests. Once students take the PSAT they will have access to Khan Academy, a great online resource for reading and math, and SAT practice, and scholarship information.

**November 19th -** all grade 10 students will participate

in the FSA Grade 10 Writing Field Test. The ELA Writing is a standalone field-test administration, which is periodically required to gather essential data and establish scoring guidelines for future field-tested prompts. The information collected in this field test is vital to the future development of statewide assessments.

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### **Senior Information**

I would like to take this opportunity to communicate to the parents of the Class of 2020 important items toward a successful end to High School. As we get closer to graduation, it becomes increasingly important that you assist in the development of your student's plan toward completion of high school.

IF YOUR SENIOR STUDENT IS DEFICIENT IN ANY OF THE GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS STATED BELOW- PLEASE CALL ME IMMEDIATELY AT 454-1005 TO DISCUSS AND CREATE AN APPROPRIATE GRADUATION PLAN!

\*\*Adult Education for Credit Make Up has already begun this semester but students can still start a course. They MUST see me for a co-enrollee form before they start. Adult Ed is held at 1225 Clearlake Rd in Cocoa.

The high school diploma requires:

- A student earns a minimum of 26 credits: 4 credits in English; 4 credits in Math including Algebra
  1 and Geometry; 4 credits in Science including Biology and Chemistry or Physical Science; 4
  credits in Social Studies including World History, US History, American Government, Economics;
  1 online course requirement; 1 HOPE credit; 1 Performing/Fine Art credit; .5 Career Research
  and Decision Making; and a minimum of 3 accelerated credits OR a sequence of 3 courses
  in a Career and Technical Program
- Passing Score on the 10th grade FSA English Language assessment or Concordant score on SAT or ACT.
- Passing Score on the Algebra 1 EOC or PERT concordant score
- Minimum of a 2.0 Cumulative GPA
- > Pay close attention to your student's attendance. The district policy states that if a student exceeds 9 days of UNEXCUSED absence each semester, they will Fail due to attendance (FA) and lose credit for the semester and possibly jeopardizing graduation.
- > For current information regarding Bright Futures scholarship status, Financial aid, College and career preparation and applications log on to <a href="www.myfloridashines.org">www.myfloridashines.org</a>. The district will upload all 12th grade transcripts to Bright Futures for evaluation. Your student can apply for the Bright Future scholarship after October 1st at <a href="www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org">www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org</a>. I will be going into the English classrooms after October 1st to walk students through the application together.
- You can access scholarship information that MIHS has been aware of by signing up for electronic news email newsletter by going to the Merritt Island High website.
- > Regardless of income, ALL families should complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Go to <a href="https://www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> to complete the application after October 1st.
- Letters of recommendation should be requested from Counselor, Coach, Teacher at least 2 weeks prior to when you would like to have them sent AND provide a resume with your request. Go to the websites of the colleges and universities where your student is applying to verify application deadlines and process.
- > Students can take the SAT and ACT as many times as they would like. For ACT register at <a href="https://www.sat.org/register">www.sat.org/register</a>. BRIGHT FUTURES will "superscore" to arrive at a qualifying score BUT never assume that the same is true for every college or university. Visit each school's website to determine how they calculate college admissions scores.
- > NCAA: If your student is seeking athletic scholarship to play Division I or II college sports, you MUST file an application with the NCAA. The application booklet is available at <a href="https://www.athleticscholarships.net/NCAA/Eligibility">www.athleticscholarships.net/NCAA/Eligibility</a>.

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## Class of 2022 Sophomore Parents and Guardians

Welcome to the 10th grade year! The following is pertinent information to the Sophomore year of High School:

- A student is classified a 10th grader (promoted from 9th grade) after earning a minimum of 5 credits. If your student has failed a course in 9th grade and did not attend Summer School, please see Ms. Tournade immediately to discuss a plan for getting back on track for graduation in 2022.
- All 10th graders will be taking the PSAT (Preliminary SAT) on October 16th, 2019. If your student
  is classified a 10th grader, they will be taking PSAT at NO CHARGE and DO NOT HAVE TO SIGN
  UP. Performance on the PSAT will indicate the skill level of each student, in preparation for
  the SAT College Admissions test recommended during the Spring of Junior Year.
- All 10th grade students will be taking The FSA/ELA (Florida Standardized Assessment for English Language) in the Spring of 10th grade. This is a 3 day test that includes 1 day of writing and 2 days of Reading and is the test that is required to pass in order to earn a standard High School diploma.

CHECKLIST

- The Brevard County Graduation credit requirements are as follows:
  - 4 English credits
  - 4 Math credits-must include Algebra and Geometry
  - 4/3 Science- must include Biology and a Physical Science
  - 4/3 Social Studies must include World History, American History, Economics .5 and American Government .5
  - HOPE- or 2 years of ROTC and /or 2 seasons of a JV or Varsity Sport
  - 1 credit of a Performing / Fine or Practical Art
  - 1 on-line course through Florida Virtual School (FLVS)/ Brevard Virtual School (BVS)
  - RIGOROUS COURSEWORK REQUIREMENT- In order to graduate from Brevard County Schools with a standard diploma a student must complete a MINIMUM of 3 credits in HONORS or ACCELLERATE

MINIMUM of 3 credits in HONORS or ACCELLERATED Coursework OR/and

- Complete a sequence of 3 courses in a CTE (Career and Technical Education)
- 8.5 Elective Credits-
- At 5pm on October 3rd in the Auditorium There will be an important informational meeting
  for all 10th grade parents. Among the topics to be discussed are PSAT, Updated Bright Futures
  Scholarship requirements, Dual Enrollment, Advanced Placement courses, the High School
  Transcripts, updated College Admission requirements, TESTING!!! Requirements for graduation,
  grade calculation and GPA, Attendance requirements, Florida Shines.org, etc.

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
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### Dual Enrollment, Collegiate High School and Early Admissions

Dual Enrollment provides free college credits through Eastern Florida State College for upcoming 10th, 11th and 12th graders. Students planning on participating in Dual Enrollment at EFSC next year or during the summer will start this process in January for the 2020 -2021 school year. Your school counselor can check eligibility and provide directions and necessary paperwork. To qualify, students must have the following completed by May 2020;

- A minimum high school cumulative GPA of 3.0 for all AA degree and AS degree options
- Passing scores on the PERT or SAT/ACT
- Attendance at an EFSC Orientation (dates available throughout the school year)
- EFSC application online (provide official high school transcripts at EFSC Orientation)

Once the application process is completed, the student will need an appointment with their high school counselor to select the appropriate EFSC courses and an additional meeting with an EFSC Advisor to register for classes at the college.

**Collegiate High School:** Students presently in 9th or 10th grade who meet eligibility for Dual Enrollment and know they want to pursue a 2 year AA degree, will receive an invitation to attend the "Collegiate High School" Informational meeting in January 2020. The program provides transportation to 10th graders taking college classes and committed to completing the AA degree.

**Present DE:** For students currently in Dual Enrollment, the appointments for EFSC Spring 2020 classes will start in mid-September 2019. It is imperative that students meet with their MIHS school counselor to complete the DE registration form required and return three (3) EFSC schedules to the MIHS Media Center along with a booklist. **NOTE:** Once school lets out for Winter Break, students will miss the opportunity to register for EFSC courses and the ability to receive books or vouchers. **EFSC classes may start on or prior to BPS**.

**Early Admissions/Upcoming Seniors:** Students planning to attend EFSC full time during their senior year are considered Early Admissions. The Early Admissions packets will arrive sometime in mid-February 2020. There will be announcements to attend the mandatory "Early Admissions meeting(s)" where the packets and information will be distributed. Qualifications for Early Admissions are the same criteria as Dual Enrollment (GPA, test scores, etc.). HOWEVER, students ALSO need to have ALL high school graduation requirements completed with the acceptation of; 1 credit HS English, 1 credit HS Science Elective; 1 credit HS Social Studies Elective, 1 HS credit in Math, ½ credit in Performing Arts. The packet deadline to EFSC is @April 2020 (TBA) and will require your counselor signature/form before submitting to EFSC.
