#### YEAR END REPORT CARDS

Mooresville High School will mail home final report cards the week of June 17, 2019. If you do not receive your student's report card in the mail, please contact the school.

#### MHS SUMMER SCHOOL INFO

Mooresville High School Summer School classes will be held at Mooresville Middle School (Kistler Farm Rd) from June 17-28. We will only be offering select courses depending on our number of students who need to retake courses. Please continue to check the school website for further information and registration. Summer school hours are 7:30a-2:15p. Transportation, breakfast, and lunch will be available.

In order to be eligible to take a course during summer school, students must earn a final course grade between 50 and 59. If a student earns a final course grade below a 50, he or she must repeat the course the following school year. The purpose of this requirement is to maintain course integrity and ensure that students have obtained the necessary knowledge and skills to be successful at the next level of coursework.

Announcements and call-outs home will occur as we approach the end of the semester. Students must sign-up for Summer School with our Counseling Department. Stay tuned for further information! #### CAPSTONE PRESENTATIONS

Capstone Projects will be presented on Wednesday, May 15th from 3:00pm-5:00pm. If you are interested in serving as a judge, please send an email to mhscapstoneproject@mgsd.k12.nc.us. Serving as a judge is also a great way for parents and guardians of our 9th, 10th and 11th-grade students to learn about the project.

### LAPTOP COLLECTION

Laptop collection this year will take place based on the student's last final exam. The collection will take place in either the Help Desk or in the Main Gym depending on the day. Students are required to turn in their laptop and their charger. Seniors are required to turn in their backpacks.

On May 28th, Help Desk students will distribute baggies to 2nd block teachers. These baggies are for students to put their chargers in during collection.

## OUTSIDE FOOD POLICY

Students are not allowed to bring outside food to school for consumption during the school day. Parents are reminded that food from local fast food restaurants is not permitted during the school day. Also, students are reminded that they are not to leave campus during the school day or during lunch. When a student is assigned to lunch, they are only permitted in the cafeteria and the amphitheater.

### STUDENTS SHINE AT CTSO COMPETITIONS

- All of the Career and Technical Student Organization state competitions are held in Greensboro with the exception of HOSA this year.
- Four DECA students traveled to state competition in March and all of them received proficient status in their events.
- Thirteen students attended HOSA state competition in Charlotte and six of them were invited to compete at the International Leadership Competition in Orlando in June. One student will compete in the healthy lifestyle event and the remaining five will compete in public health.
- FBLA had ten students attend state competition and one of them received a bid to compete in Accounting II at the International Competition in San Antonio in June.
- FCCLA had four students attend state competition and both teams received silver ratings.
- SkillsUSA has sixty students attending state competition mid-April.

### SPRING FINAL EXAM SCHEDULE

This spring's Final Exam Schedule will be similar to last year's plan...but please pay close attention! Our exams will begin at 7:30am on Friday, May 31st with our English II, Biology, and Math I EOCs. The only students who are required to report on May 31st are those students taking these three exams.

On Monday, June 3rd, we will have our Math III EOC and English II/Biology/Math I EOC makeup exams beginning at 7:30am. The only students who are required to report on June 3rd are those students taking these exams.

On June 4th - June 7th, the only students who are required to report to campus are those students taking an exam during the specified blocks (see below). In addition, if a student is aiming for perfect attendance, they should report every day from May 31st - June 7th. Lunch will be provided each day and buses will only run their normal arrival and dismissal times each day.

Laptops will be collected every day of exams. Students are required to turn in their laptop **after** their last exam.

## CHANGES TO THE GRADUATION CEREMONY

In 2017 the MGSD School Board approved the use of the Latin Honor System instead of recognizing a Valedictorian and Salutatorian, effective with with graduating Class of 2019. As a result of this decision, there will be several changes to this year's Graduation Ceremony. These changes were discussed with the students, faculty and parents during School Improvement Team meetings throughout the year. They were also reviewed and approved by Dr. Mauney.

#### NORTH CAROLINA SCHOLARS

Graduates who earned an unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher, and have met course requirements set by NCDPI will be recognized as North Carolina Academic Scholars. They will be recognized during the commencement ceremony with a gold tassel and seal on the graduates' diploma.

Latin Honors and NC Scholar will be notated with graduate names in the printed program.

#### **GRADUATION SPEAKERS**

For the graduating classes of 2019, 2020, and 2021, there will be no more than 3 student speakers. The student with the 3rd highest GPA will give the Opening Remarks. The students with the highest and 2nd highest GPAs will give the keynote addresses. While the Valedictorian and Salutatorian will no longer be recognized, we realize the hard work students have put into earning these honors and wish to carry on the traditional graduation speakers for students who were already working towards this opportunity.

Beginning with the graduating class of 2022 and beyond, the Opening Remarks will be reserved for the Student Government Association President, whom must be a senior, followed in succession by the Senior Class President. The two keynote addresses will be selected by a committee based on an application process for seniors who wish to speak at graduation.

#### MHS STUDENT PARKING PERMIT INFORMATION

Student parking permits will go on sale in late July for the upcoming year. Students with outstanding fines or fees with the school district will not be approved to purchase a parking permit. Students can request approval to purchase Parking Permits in the Info for Students section of the MHS website around the middle of July. Priority will be given to seniors, then to juniors and students with CCP and internship classes, then to sophomores.

Parking permits will be \$60 per permit and allow the student to park in one specific lot for the entire year.

#### PARKING ON CAMPUS REMINDERS

Students who park on campus must remember to abide by the following: 1. Park in your assigned lot.

- 2. Make sure the sticker is attached to the windshield in the proper location.
- 3. When driving a different car, to sign it in with the office to avoid a ticket.

Failure to follow these rules may result in a loss of driving privileges.

#### SHUTTLE BUS AND PARKING AT N.F. WOODS

During each class change, students are shuttled between the Magnolia Campus and N.F. Woods. Students are not permitted to use their own vehicles to transport themselves, or others, between campuses during the day. Only students that are scheduled for N.F. Woods for their first class and last class are permitted to park at N.F. Woods. These students must contact Ms. Scott for permission to park on the N.F. Woods campus.

#### MHS PROM

The 2019 MHS Prom is Saturday, May 18 at the Charles Mack Citizen Center. This year's theme is "Enchanted Garden". The cost of each ticket is \$50. Tickets go on sale on Tuesday, April 23 and tickets sales will conclude Friday, April 26, 2018. Tickets can only be purchased during lunch (10:46am-12:43pm) Tuesday through Friday outside the cafeteria or after school ONLY on Wednesday and Thursday (2:21-3:30pm) in Room A265 (on Main Campus). No tickets will be sold during instructional time. Non-MHS students who attend prom will need a Guest Form to be completed for them by Friday, April 5. All completed forms should be turned in to the Main Office.

Attending prom is a privilege and the following requirements must be met in order to purchase a ticket: 1. You can not be on the Loss of Privileges list

- 2. All fines and fees must be paid. Exceptions will be made however if payments are being sent towards your debt to Mooresville Graded School District.
- 3. You must not have any excessive absences in a class during the 2018-2019 school year
- 4. You can not have any pending criminal charges

We want everyone to have an amazing time; therefore, the following expectations are made of anyone attending the event:

- 1. You must be a student classified as a junior or a senior in PowerSchool at Mooresville High School by the start of the 2nd semester.
  - OR Guests of a Mooresville High School junior or senior:
  - May be a Mooresville High School sophomore or freshman (10th or 9th grade)
  - May be a <u>student at another high school (9th-12th grade)</u> (a Guest form must be submitted no later than April 5, and approval must be received in order to purchase a ticket for this guest. The guest must bring a PHOTO ID to enter)
  - May have <u>graduated high school</u> but be UNDER the age of 21 (a Guest form must be submitted no later than April 5, and approval must be received in order to purchase a ticket for this guest. The guest must bring a PHOTO ID to enter)
- 2. You must have a ticket purchased in your name by Friday, April 26. Tickets can not be transfered for any reason. No refunds will be granted once a ticket is purchased.
- 3. Prom doors open at 8pm, you must enter NO later than 10pm.
- 4. Once you exit Prom, you will NOT be allowed to re-enter.

#### LOSS OF PRIVILEGES PLAN

Participation in extracurricular activities, whether it be as a studentathlete, club member, or spectator, is a valuable experience for any high school student. Extracurricular activities are a source of school pride, provide opportunities for students to engage in their passions, and challenge students in a variety of ways that are not always possible in the classroom. Extracurricular activities are also a privilege, and certain, but rare, circumstances merit the revocation of these privileges. This school year, Mooresville High School will implement the Loss of Privilege Plan (LoP Plan) to determine when, and for how long a privilege should be revoked. Additionally, this plan lays out the steps by which a student may appeal the revocation of his/her privileges.

There are two ways in which a student may lose his/her privileges, each with a defined period of time for the revocation of privileges:

- 1. Accruing 8 or more unexcused tardies for a period in a semester.
- 2. Assigned 5 or more Out-of-School Suspension days, cumulatively, over the course of a school year.






## TARDY PLAN



- 8th Tardy: Loss of Privileges, In-School Suspension, Parent/Guardian Contact




#### MATH TUTORING! (MATH I, MATH II, AND MATH III)
