PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

- 2. CREATE THE ENVIRONMENT: Students can be easily distracted. Create an atmosphere conducive for concentration. Minimizing social media/phone access, loud music, and other detractors will improve effectiveness and retention. If you notice distractions or deterrents, suggest possible remedies. Having a defined study area works with some students but not all. The most important factor is the discipline of doing it every day.
- 3. OBSERVE AND ENGAGE: Psychologists suggest that it takes three weeks to replace an old habit with a new habit. When school resumes, commit three weeks to observe your students daily routine. Make

good homework practices a habit for both of you. Your daily assistance and attitude toward school have a huge impact on your student's success.

OPEN HOUSE

ATTENTION PARENTS/GUARDIANS -A NOTE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

All immunization records must be current and up to date. Students who are new to MGSD must provide their immunization records on or before the 30th day of school. After the 30th day, if records have not been received, your child will not be allowed to attend classes. This is a North Carolina state law and is followed in our district. It is the parent/guardian's responsibility to make sure the previous school sends the record.

SUSPICIONLESS DRUG TESTING POLICY

In June of 2018, the MGSD School Board passed Policy 4326, Random Suspicionless Student Drug Testing, which will be continue to implemented during the 2019-20 school year.

In order for MHS students to purchase a parking pass, participate in athletics, or competitive clubs and organizations, a parent/guardian must consent for their student's participation in the random suspicionless drug testing program. Parents/Guardians may also voluntarily elect to have their student involved in the program by completing a consent form.

Parents, guardians, and students are encouraged to review the policy in its entirety, which is located on the MGSD School Board website.

CLASS OF 2023 FRESHMEN ORIENTATION EVENT

MHS Staff and Students are excited to welcome the Class of 2023 to our Freshmen Orientation event on Wednesday, July 31, 2019 from 8am to 12pm in the Main Gym! This event will be led by a few of our staff members, but primarily by a select group of students called LINK Leaders. This is a STUDENTS ONLY event in which incoming freshmen will meet their upperclassmen mentors, be given their schedules, and receive a tour of the campus. Students should dress comfortably and are not required to bring anything with them. ALL freshmen are expected to be in attendance.

STUDENT SCHEDULES

Student schedules will be mailed home on July 30th for sophomores, juniors and seniors. Freshmen will recieve their schedule during Orientation on July 31st. Our administration and counseling staff has worked very hard to honor student course requests by building our master schedule around those requests. Due to the continuous efforts of our school counselors to keep class sizes at an appropriate level and offer as many engaging elective courses, there will be **no schedule changes**. Thank you for respecting this necessary practice by honoring your course requests. If you have any questions, please contact your student's counselor.

FOOD POLICY

Students are not allowed to bring food or consume food from an outside restaurant during school hours. Food from outside restaurants will be confiscated from students and returned to them at the end of the school day. Additionally, students may not leave campus during the school day to purchase food from outside restaurants or order food from delivery services such as Uber Eats, Door Dash, etc.





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CALCULATOR RENTALS & LETTER

Parents and families are encouraged to look for deals this summer on a graphing calculator for your student. Although it is not a requirement for students to



own a calculator, we do encourage families to consider purchasing a TI-83 Plus graphing calculator for your student to use during their math and advanced science classes. The calculator will be used during all four years of high school math and in college as well. Be sure to check local stores and websites for discounts on graphing calculators!

Students who do not have their own calculator can sign-out a TI-83 Plus graphing calculator from the Media Center. If a student loses or does not return the schoolissued graphing calculator, he/ she is required to replace or pay \$100 for the calculator. Students who have not returned a graphing calculator from the previous year are expected to pay for or replace the TI-83 Plus calculator prior to renting another one, withdrawing from school, receiving their diploma or purchasing parking permits and prom tickets.

STUDENT PARKING

In order to purchase a parking permit, you must complete the pre-approval form. We have put this step in place to reduce the wait time for students to purchase their parking pass. Go to tinyurl.com/2019MHSParking to complete the form that went live on June 12th. Once the form is complete, you will receive further instructions on when you may come to the school to purchase your parking permit.



Students will be assigned to park in a lot, not an individual space. This will be their assigned lot for

the entire school year. We will attempt to honor as many requests as possible. Students must park only in their assigned lot and will not be allowed to change parking lots during the year, nor share their permit with other students.

Students will not be approved to purchase a parking permit if they have any outstanding fines or fees. Students that do not have internet access may visit the Main office Monday through Thursday between the hours of 8:00am and 4:00pm to submit their request for approval.

Seniors that submit and meet the requirements for approval, will have first priority. Once approved, students will be instructed to bring in the necessary documents and money to the main office to purchase the permit. The necessary items include:

- 2019-20 Parking Permit Application/Guidelines read and signed by parent ٠ and student.
- Valid Driver's License
- Vehicle Registration
- \$60 in the form of cash or check

Remember that parking on campus is a privilege and not a right, and can be revoked at any time by the school administration, without cause. If you have any questions regarding student parking, please call the Mooresville High School office and speak to Ms. Amy Wilson.

ATTENDANCE & TARDY INFO

We believe that good attendance and punctuality are life skills that we have the responsibility to teach each of our students. Attendance should be a major priority for all students and families.

A STUDENT MUST PROVIDE A NOTE WITHIN 3 DAYS OF AN ABSENCE. PLEASE BRING YOUR NOTE TO A CAMPUS OFFICE ASAP. DO NOT GIVE ATTENDANCE NOTES TO TEACHERS.

The following are reasons for temporary non-attendance of students:

Excused Absences

- 1. Illness, injury, and quarantine
- 2. Death in the immediate family
- 3. Medical or dental appointments (with proper documentation)
- 4. Court proceedings
- 5. Religious observances with prior notification to the principal
- 6. Educational opportunities with prior approval from the principal

*Educational opportunities do not include family vacations, athletic-related camps or tournaments.

Unexcused Absences

Any absence that does not meet the requirements of an excused absence will be coded as an unexcused absence.

Students who miss more than 6 days in a course will not receive credit for that course. ALL absences (whether excused or unexcused) count towards the 6-day limit.

Students whose course credit may be withheld due to the violation of the attendance policy have the right to appeal. In cases of **extreme** hardship (extended hospitalization, serious extended illness) the principal or appeals committee may decide to award course credit. Appeals packets may be picked up in a designated location and must be returned by the specified due date near the end of each semester along with all appropriate and/or required documentation. The appeals committee will not waive absences due to routine illnesses (flu, colds, etc.), OSS, skipping school, or truancy.

Punctual, reliable transportation to and from school is a student's responsibility. Students can achieve this by riding a school bus. Students who choose to provide their own transportation accept full responsibility for getting to school on time.

The following is a list of valid excuses for tardiness:

- Illness
- Medical or dental appointments
- Injury
- Court proceedings
- Daycare responsibilities
- Religious observances
- School-related activities
- Others w/ approval of an administrator

NOTE: The following circumstances are not valid tardy excuses: missed bus, missed ride, late ride, oversleeping, and routine traffic delays.


