## WINTER ATHLETES MEETING

All Winter Athletes **AND** parents must attend the meeting on Monday, October 23 at 6:00 pm in the Main Gym. Students and parents who attended the Fall Athlete Meeting do not need to attend. This meeting will cover important topics regarding concussions, the Student-Athlete Code of Conduct, and the Random Suspicionless Drug Testing Policy. There will be another meeting for Spring Athletes later in the school year, however spring athletes are welcome to attend this meeting in advance of their season.

## **OUTSIDE FOOD POLICY**

Students are not allowed to bring outside food to school for consumption during the school day. Parents are reminded that food from local fast food restaurants is not permitted during the school day. Also, students are reminded that they are not to leave campus during the school day or during lunch. When a student is assigned to lunch, they are only permitted in the cafeteria and the amphitheater.

## DRESS CODE REMINDER

Mooresville High School maintains a dress code to promote attire that is appropriate for an educational setting and promotes dress standards for the workplace. The complete dress code can be found in the Student Handbook, but below are a few points of emphasis.

- Tops must cover shoulders (at least 3 inches)
- Skirts and dresses must come to fingertip length when student is standing upright
- Shorts must come to the lowest knuckle when student is standing upright and making a fist.
- Holes in pants must not be above knuckle length when student is standing upright
- Hats and hoodies are not permitted inside the buildings
- Shirts must not show midriff or torso below the armpit
- Pajamas of other sleepwear are not permitted

Students who violate the dress code will be provided with the option to wear school issued clothing to prevent the loss of instructional time.

## ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

Daily attendance, active participation in each class, and appropriate behavior are critical parts of student success in school. These expectations also prepare students to be successful after high school. Therefore, students are expected to attend school everyday. Attendance is the responsibility of the student and parents/guardians. If a student is absent from school, please provide the proper documentation within 3 days of returning to school to any campus office. Students who have more than 6 absences after factoring in "attendance recovery time" will be invited to appeal absences for extenuating circumstances (ex: death in the family, hospitalization).

## PARKING ON CAMPUS REMINDERS

Students who park on campus must remember to abide by the following:

- 1. Park in your assigned lot.
- 2. Make sure the sticker is attached to the windshield in the proper location.
- 3. When driving a different car, to sign it in with the office to avoid a ticket.

Failure to follow these rules may result in a loss of driving privileges.

## STUDENT DROP-OFF

Parents who drop off students in the morning must use the drop-off lines at the front of Main or Magnolia campuses. For student safety, students should not be dropped off on the street or in the school parking lots.

## PARKING OFF-CAMPUS

Students who park off-campus are encouraged to pay close attention to posted parking restrictions. Mooresville Police has informed the school that they will closely monitor the surrounding area and enforce the posted parking restrictions throughout the day.

## SHUTTLE BUS AND PARKING AT N.F. WOODS

During each class change, students are shuttled between the Magnolia Campus and N.F. Woods. Students are not permitted to use their own vehicles to transport themselves, or others, between campuses during the day. Only students that are scheduled for N.F. Woods for their first class and last class are permitted to park at N.F. Woods. These students must contact Ms. Scott for permission to park on the N.F. Woods campus.

## CAPSTONE JUDGES NEEDED!

All Seniors at Mooresville High School are required to participate in the Capstone Project as part of their graduation requirement. Each student chooses a topic that is of interest, completes a minimum of 15 hour of hands-on learning about the topic, researches the topic, then writes an annotated bibliography on the topic. Once completed, the students create a digital portfolio of their learning experience. The Capstone Project culminates in a 15 minute presentation on the topic to a panel of 3-5 judges.

We are in search of community members and parents who are willing to donate two hours of an afternoon to judge Capstone Projects. As a member of the Capstone Project Review Board, you will have the opportunity to view the student's portfolios, listen to their oral presentations and ask them questions.

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## TARDY PLAN

Students are expected to report to each class on time to maximize instructional time in the classroom. Failure to report to class on time will be tracked and consequences will be assigned accordingly. The consequences reset at the start of each semester.

Tardy # 8+	In-School Suspension or Other Discipline as determined by the administrator and Loss of Privilege List (until end of next quarter)		

- A "Tardy" is defined as being up to 5 minutes late for class and will follow the above guidelines.
- "Excessive Tardiness" is be being 6+ minutes last for class and carries a consequence of After School Detention on the 1st offense.
- More than 30 minutes late to class will be coded as an absence including the "excessive tardy" consequence.

## CELL PHONE ENFORCEMENT PLAN

Mooresville High School embraces the benefits of technology in teaching and learning. Additionally, the district and school devotes significant resources to training teachers and students on the proper use of technology in the classroom to enhance instruction. However, the prevalent and disruptive use of cell phones by students during class has a negative impact on instruction as they become distracted by notifications, the use of social media, and the time teachers take to address inappropriate cell phone use.

Therefore, when a student chooses to use a cell phone during class without permission from the teacher as part of an educational activity, he/she will receive a printed notification that he/she was observed using a cell phone inappropriately. An office referral will be submitted by the teacher. An administrator, or designee, will confiscate the phone. The phone will be logged and locked up until a parent or guardian comes to school to pick it up from school during school office hours.

Participation in extracurricular activities, whether it be as a student-athlete, club member or spectator, is a valuable experience for any high school student. Extracurricular activities are a source of school pride, provide opportunities for students to engage in their passions, and challenge students in a variety of ways that are not always possible in the classroom. Extracurricular activities are also a privilege, and certain, but rare, circumstances merit the revocation of these privileges. This school year, Mooresville High School will implement the Loss of Privilege Plan (LoP Plan) to determine when, and for how long a privilege should be revoked. Additionally, this plan lays out the steps by which a student may appeal the revocation of his/her privileges.

There are two ways in which a student may lose his/her privileges, each with a defined period of time for the revocation of privileges:

- 1. Accruing 8 unexcused period tardies in a semester.
- 2. Assigned 5 or more Out-of-School Suspension days, cumulatively, over the course of a school year.

## PRE-ACT

All 10th grade students will take the Pre-ACT on October 31st during the school day. Not only does this test prepare students for the ACT (taken by all 11th grade students) but it also provides students and parents with valuable information. After taking the Pre-ACT, students are provided a detailed score report that identifies areas to improve in preparation for the ACT, and possible career paths based on the interest survey and performance on the Pre-ACT.
